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The history of history

In the early 2000s, annual grasses became increasingly popular. However, the seedlings on the market did not meet the high quality standards required to quickly and efficiently produce a high-performance plant for the consumer: the seedlings had little branching, their root system was insufficiently developed and they had not acquired the energy needed to economically develop a plant of interest to the market.

This observation was the trigger that convinced DECO-Style® founder Normand Tellier to carry out research and development into the production of certain grasses in order to produce seedlings of optimum quality for profitable marketing.

The first steps

In September 2006, following an advertisement by Athens Select announcing the arrival of a high-potential grass for the Quebec horticultural market, the purple pennisetum 'Prince', the founder of DECO-Style® set about taming the production of these plants in order to achieve the greatest possible market impact with these promising stars.

In October 2007, with the support of JVK Sales Director Annick Hamel, a commercial link was established with internationally renowned professor Dr. Allan Ermitage. At the time, he was head of the Research and Development Section of the Department of Ornamental Horticulture at the University of Georgia in the United States. This meeting led to the signing of propagation contracts in July 2008. DECO-Style® is now the only company in Canada to be part of the prestigious Athens Select group, whose aim is to oversee the commercial and research process. Lisa Tellier is in charge of follow-up.

Steps are being taken to learn more about the conditions under which these plants are grown and to tame their production methods. The question then arises: why not share this expertise with the horticultural industry!

An integrated concept

This led to the idea of developing a systematic approach aimed at providing growers with a complete marketing program to facilitate their work, thanks to a uniform, integrated strategy giving visibility and credibility to the range of products selected.

Horticolor, under the coordination of Philip Thompson, has been given the mandate to structure the guiding principles identified for this new marketing program. One of the names they have come up with is DECO-Style®.

Once the DECO-Style® logo had been created, a system of labels, displays and growing containers to personalize our products and raise consumer awareness of the brand was put in place.

Research & development

From the outset, Lisa Tellier took charge of product research, sourcing and marketing. Gaining worldwide recognition over the years, she is a key element in the development of DECO-Style®.

The owner of DECO-Style® also teams up with a horticultural journalist, Rock Giguère, to support him in his search for innovative products to market, and to take photos that highlight his finds.



Our trio visits trial gardens and major exhibitions in the United States, Europe, and Canada to identify unknown or under-commercialized plants that are easy to produce and cultivate. The development of the resulting network allows DECO-Style® to gain international recognition, and horticultural enterprises worldwide begin to suggest products that could be included in its range.

Once the products are identified, it is necessary to test the promising products to understand their production and cultivation methods. This is undoubtedly a very important activity for DECO-Style®.

From the beginning, the most interesting plants for the market are sent to evaluation or demonstration sites, such as the Daniel E. Séguin Garden, where Les Exceptionnelles® are judged; the Annual Plant Evaluation Site at the Roger-Van den Hende Botanical Garden; and the New Varieties Garden at the Montreal Botanical Garden. Gradually, this evaluation network extends to several other regions of Quebec to verify the performance of DECO-Style® plants under the widest possible range of growing conditions.

In parallel with these evaluations, tests are conducted in our greenhouses to see if the product is easy to produce. Based on the results obtained, the DECO-Style® team then proceeds with the final selection of products.

To organize them, the plants are cataloged under the classifications of classic, elegant, bold, and trendy.

Sourcing

During the development of the DECO-Style® concept, many interesting plants that align with the vision and quest for novelty and innovation are discovered. After more than 15 years of evolution, DECO-Style®'s credibility allows it to discuss and negotiate directly with prestigious companies from around the world: Asia, Australia, Europe, Central America, South America, North America, and even Africa.

Many suppliers also send their discoveries and some new varieties to test and see if they meet customer needs. These signs of trust, received from marketing agents and even agencies that manage hybridizers' rights, now provide the possibility to expand global access to certain products, allowing for an avant-garde and refined offering of plants from around the world.

Given the cosmopolitan nature and success of DECO-Style®, the World of Plants that brings the south to the north is within your reach!

Production

For fifteen years, DECO-Style® has been developing while taking into account changes in consumer needs and horticultural technologies to produce plants with maximum quality and provide the best possible service to its customers.

Over time and through its research, DECO-Style® has developed techniques for producing healthy plants with strengthened physiology for easy and successful production of its selections. Sometimes they may seem expensive to purchase, but the production time you save and the performance gain allow you to obtain a superior plant at a lower cost.

Finally, we strive to produce with the least possible environmental impact. We continuously improve our cultivation management with the support of IQDHO advisor Benoît Champagne. Today, we use biostimulants, which have halved the use of fertilizers. Biological control products, such as predators, are used to combat harmful insects.

Our plants are therefore of superior quality while being more environmentally friendly!

The marketing to customers is mainly handled by four recognized distributors who operate in Quebec but also in Ontario, Western Canada, and the Maritimes: Norseco, JVK, Les Serres Zyromski, and Ball Superior. DECO-Style® has been a successful partner for them since its inception.

To better reach them, every year we produce a prestigious DECO-Style® guide to inform them of our new offerings and showcase featured plants that we provide.

Transport boxes identifying the DECO-Style® program are also produced to strengthen the brand.

For garden centers, a top-notch marketing support package includes large-format labels for hanging or sticking, posters of our selections, and a pot identified with the DECO-Style® program to attract consumer attention. Albuca spiralis 'Frizzle Sizzle'

This curious and intriguing plant comes to us from South Africa. 'Frizzle Sizzle' is a bulbous perennial that forms a basal rosette of corkscrew-shaped, acid-green leaves: a highly original habit that alone makes this plant worth acquiring. This spiral-shaped albuca produces a pale yellow to yellow-green flower, with a light honey fragrance, on a very rigid central stem. The basal rosette can reach 10 to 20 cm in height. The upright plant can reach 30 cm in height when in flower, and 15 to 20 cm in width. Albuca can be grown in sunny, well-drained soil, just like succulents. It can be used both indoors and outdoors. When the spiralization of the leaves diminishes significantly, severe pruning causes new spiral leaves to emerge.

Alocasia

This type of plant can be placed in full sun, part shade or in the shade. Alocases have proven their ability to withstand Quebec's summer weather conditions over the past twenty years. These architectural plants are ideal for adding height to a container arrangement, and lush dynamism to any outdoor setting, such as around a swimming pool, on a terrace or on a deck. terrace, balcony or in the ground. They are also ideal for interior decoration.



Alocasia amazonica

'Polly', formellement

The nomenclature of this plant remains controversial today in markets and in general literature. For practical purposes, we have retained the name 'Polly' even though botanically, the correct name for this plant is Alocasia 'Mortefontaine'. This hybrid species resulted from a cross between Alocasia longiloba and Alocasia sanderiana, carried out in the late 1800s by the Chantrier brothers at their establishment in the French village of Mortefontaine.

Today, botanists also consider the similarity between the Alocasia we call 'Polly' and one named 'X', which was supposedly created in the 1950s by Salvador Mauro at his nursery named Amazon Nurseries. The selection 'Polly' tends to be smaller than the one called 'X', which has no relation to Brazil. Thus, there has been controversy for **130 years!!!**

Alocasia 'Mortefontaine' features dark green arrow-shaped leaves with wavy edges and thick, white or silver veins. The underside of the leaf and the leaf stalk (petiole) are brown in color. This plant can reach a height of 50 to 60 cm. It thrives both indoors and outdoors.



Deep Chic **Alocasia baginda 'Dragon Scale'**

The leaves of this Alocasia, whose selection name translates literally as "dragon scale" due to its resemblance to reptilian scales, exhibit an incredible shimmering and veined texture. As the plant matures, the leaf colors transition to light green with a mirrored effect and silvery reflections between the veins. The surrounding space near the veins appears green-black. The dominant color of the leaf is green-black. The leaf edge has a dark green border that gives it a unique texture. The underside of the leaves is creamy green with prominent brown veins, creating a striking contrast.

This plant tends to maintain a compact form and is an excellent candidate for indoor cultivation under indirect light, away from direct sunlight. It can easily reach a height of 40 cm. **Its appearance is often described as prehistoric due to its unique features.**



Deep Chic **Alocasia baginda 'Silver Dragon'**

This species is endemic to Borneo, in Southeast Asia, where it was only recently discovered in 2011. It is one of the most compact Alocasia species in its genus. The oval and puckered leaves of the 'Silver Dragon' selection are velvety and feature a very dark vein that makes it uniquely distinctive. Its silvery-blue hues, shaded with darker emerald green around the main vein, create a beautiful color contrast. As the leaf ages, the colors become even richer. The leaf edge has a green border that gives it a unique texture. With its distinctive appearance, this exotic plant looks like it came straight out of a fairy tale. It can reach over 35 cm in height and width. **A DRAGON for your interior and shaded exterior spaces...**

Deco. chic **Alocasia boa**

This relatively rare species originates from New Guinea. It is a medium-sized *Alocasia* closely related to *Alocasia* 'Lauterbach', known for its large, vertically inclined leaves and distinctive decorative appearance. Its long, narrow green leaves are deeply serrated and contrast well with its long, sturdy stems, which are speckled like snake skin. This plant thrives in partial shade to full sun, producing numerous offsets and reaching heights of 80 to 100 cm. **It boasts a very slender silhouette.**



Deco. chic **Alocasia chantrieri**

This rare plant is highly sought after by collectors. It is a natural hybrid cross between *Alocasia cuprea* and *Alocasia sanderiana*. Its large arrow-shaped leaves are a beautiful dark green with hints of blueish reflections. The undersides of the leaves are dark brown. The leaves resemble those of its parent, *Alocasia cuprea*, but are much more elongated. The petioles are a bright brown color. This plant can reach heights of 60 to 75 cm. It is an excellent choice for indoor settings or in a cool spot in the garden.

L'alcasse cuivrée

Another jewel among alocases. In fact, one of its nicknames is "Jewel Plant". Its intriguing green and copper-red leaves with dark green veins are highly original. Their glossy texture gives the leaves a plastic appearance, which is why English speakers call it "Mirror Plant". The tops of the leaves are also very decorative, with a reddish-brown color that only adds to its beauty. Copper alocase has a slender, bushy, compact habit. A medium-sized, medium-growing plant that can be grown outdoors and is suitable for any corner of the house. The plant can reach 30 to 45 cm in height.

Originality and wonder.

Alocasia gageana 'California'

This stout Alocasia is quite distinctive. 'California' can reach heights of 70 to 80 cm. Its light green leaves with green veins measure approximately 35 to 40 cm in width. This plant is a smaller version compared to 'Calidora', making it ideal for balanced arrangements in medium-sized containers and limited spaces. The species name honors the English botanist Sir Thomas Gage (1781-1820), who was a collector of rare European plants.

Alocasia lauterbachiana

The Lauterbach alocase

This alocase native to New Guinea is also popularly known as Purple Sword because its foliage consists of narrow, sword-shaped green leaves, tinged reddish on the underside. Raised purple veins and a wavy border add great ornamental value to this plant. Its shiny, upward-pointing leaves can reach 60 cm in length. They are so shiny that they appear to be artificial. This plant can reach 60 to 90 cm.

Alocasia heterophylla 'Corazon'

Heterophyllous alocase 'Corazon' is a heterophyllous plant, **meaning it has dissimilar leaves on the same plant.** The leaves are a striking metallic blue-grey-green. The petiole is mottled like a snakeskin. This alocase, which is very similar to 'Dragon's Breath', has rounder leaves. There are no undulations on the leaf. This alocase can grow up to 45 cm tall. The selection's name honors the Philippines' first female president, Corazon Aquino (1933-2009). She was president from February 1986 to June 1992. Experts believe that this plant, which can be grown in the garden or indoors, is a separate species and not a cultivar derived from the species .

Alocasia longiloba **'Dragon's Tooth'**

This rare pearl is particularly stunning with its dark green leaves bearing prominent creamy-white veins. The leaves are shiny and almost plain. Their tips end in a sharp point like a "dragon's tooth", which is reflected in the name of this exotic plant. The glossy back of the leaf is the same color as the stems, dark burgundy. The average height of this alocase can easily reach between 50 and 60 cm. A rare tropical plant for the home.



Alocasia macrorrhizos

Large-rooted alocase, giant taro

This spectacular plant can reach 1.5 m in height under the right growing conditions, making it a giant for arrangements in large containers or in the open ground. Its broad, oval, bright-green leaves have pronounced veins and a slightly wavy margin. The petioles are very erect. This plant, native mainly to Borneo, the Philippines and New Guinea, will add an unmistakable touch of exoticism wherever you place it in your garden. **Gigantism in the garden.**

Alocasia macrorrhizos 'Borneo Giant'

This selection is the result of a series of highly complex hybridizations. It can exceed 1.2 to 1.5 meters in our northern climate with good cultivation conditions in the ground. Its leaves are very large and upright, almost straight, as are the petioles. As the leaves mature, they tend to undulate and become somewhat corrugated. Those who appreciate large exotic leaves will be well served by this selection. **Vigorous, exceptional ... a class of its own.**

Alocasia macrorrhizos Flying Squid™

Given its very dwarf form, this leaved alocase has a unique shape. What's more, the plant has an original architectural shape resembling the arms of a squid, extending to rise from the ground, as evoked by the cultivar's English name: Flying Squid™. The very small leaves, resembling the suction cups on a squid's arms, complete the ensemble. This alocase can grow to just 30 cm (12 in.) in height. This mutation of the alocase 'Serendipity' is a curiosity that is perfectly suited as a centerpiece or to decorate the terrace.

Alocasia macrorrhizos 'Metallica'

The upper surface of the leaves is dark greenish-purple, a lovely dark hue that gives them an almost metallic appearance. The silvery-purple underside contrasts well with the purple veins. The petiole is burgundy. Mature leaves are bumpy and wavy, giving this alocase an incredibly rich look. The plant can reach 90 to 120 cm in height. It prefers a shady site or a subdued light position. **Shimmering light.**



Deco. chic **Alocasia macrorrhizos 'Variegata'**

The spectacular, striking leaves of this alocase can become the centerpiece of your interior decor. Indeed, the variegation of this exotic plant's leaves is a true work of art of nature: its large leaves are splashed with mixed mottles of green, creamy white and white. From one plant to another, the leaves don't have the same variegations, which are the result of chimeras. Prominent veins mark the leaf and its margins are wavy. The plant can reach 80 to 90 cm. **Original and different.**

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Alocasia micholitziana **'Frydek'**

While it can create a tropical effect in flower beds, water garden borders, and container gardening, *Alocasia micholitziana* 'Frydek' is also perfect as an indoor plant because it doesn't require too much light to thrive in our homes. This *Alocasia*, native to the Philippines, can tolerate full sun as well as partial shade. Its emerald green leaves are adorned with prominent, shiny white veins, making them highly distinctive. Additionally, its stems feature pleasant striations of purplish bands. The plant can reach heights and widths of 45 to 60 cm. **It brings a unique and original touch of brightness whether indoors or outdoors.**

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Alocasia micholitziana **'Velvet Elvis'**

'Velvet Elvis', a very recent selection, owes its name to its velvety dark green leaves highlighted by a slight curvature and very shiny white veins. Its petioles are green. This *Alocasia*'s tolerance to indoor and outdoor conditions is excellent. It is smaller than its cousin 'Frydek', reaching only 35 to 45 cm in height. **That's why it's often referred to as the dwarf 'Frydek'.**

N *Alocasia nebula* 'Imperialis'

Australian botanist Alistair, a specialist in aroids which include the genus *Alocasia*, described the true botanical identity of the species *nebula* in the year 2000. He first observed it in the mid-1990s in northwest Malaysia. Before this, it was known simply as "cultivated *Alocasia*". *Alocasia nebula* 'Imperialis' is a royal highness known among collectors for its luminous and thick leaves, with an otherworldly appearance overall, featuring a bluish-gray hue. Dark-colored main veins run through the leaf. The underside of the leaf is colored wine red. This horticultural jewel can reach a height of 60 cm. Truly an imperial sovereign.



N *Alocasia odora*

The name of the species, , evokes the sweet smell given off by the flower of this alocase, especially at night. English speakers call it the "night-scented lily". If you want to create a "guaranteed jungle effect", opt for the lush foliage of alocase odorante. Its medium-green, heart-shaped, wavy leaves point skyward. They can measure up to 40 cm in length and 30 cm in width. When young, the leaves are lime-green and shiny. This plant can reach 60 to 80 cm in height, and its basal multiplication is significant. The plant is native to East and Southeast Asia. **A classic**

Deco chic **▣** ***Alocasia perakensis* 'Silver Giant'**

The distribution of the Perakensis species extends from Thailand to the Malaysian peninsula. It was only in 2021/2022 that Perak alocase was tissue-cultured to give us the 'Silver Giant' selection. As the cultivar's name suggests, the decorative foliage of this very hardy alocase is made up of superb, rather leathery silver leaves textured with green accents. The leaves have an almost metallic sheen. Always remember that alocase leaf colors become more defined with age. The plant can reach 60 to 75 cm in height.



Deco chic **▣** ***Alocasia princeps* 'Purple Cloak'**

Two cultivars are derived from the species: 'Candy Sticks' and 'Purple Cloak'. The 'Purple Cloak' selection, highly prized for indoor use, is stunning with its glossy, arrow-shaped, almost black-green leaves, an incredible dark color. The underside is colored burgundy, contrasting with striking purplish-burgundy veins. The plant is compact and can reach 80 to 100 cm in height. **A real gem.**

L'alo case royale

The downy-looking upper leaf surface of this alo case native to Borneo appears grayish-green in the light. At other times, the leaves of this rare plant appear bluish and silvery, a distinctive color that adds a little mystery to this exotic plant that remains relatively small, reaching around 60 cm in height. When the leaf is juvenile, the underside is bright reddish-brown, turning greenish as it matures. This plant, which truly resembles a queen, is also appreciated for its distinctive green-black veins. It can be grown both indoors and outdoors. **A queen.**

Alocasia reversa

Reverse alo case

Another dwarf alo case that can easily be grown indoors. The plant reaches only 40 cm in height and width. Its thick, smooth leaves come in various shades of dark green, pale green and silver. Leaf color is darker on and near the veins. The underside of the leaf and the petiole are a bright green. This alo case takes its name from the fact that the leaf shape is inverted, rather like the 'Tea Cup' colocase with its cup-shaped leaves. This species was first described from a cultivated plant in Great Britain and has never been found in the wild.

Alocasia sarawakensis 'Yucatan Princess'

The cultivar 'Yucatan Princess' is part of the Masquerade™ series of alocases whose leaves recall the original designs of Mayan and Zulu masks. This is the black form of the Sarawak alocase, a selection that astonishes us when we first see it with the color of its foliage and its slender habit. The erect, glossy leaves of this Yucatan princess are colored from dark green to black, with a brown underside, giving it a very interesting exotic touch that is enhanced by a bumpy texture. The dark chocolate-colored stems contrast well with the color of the leaves. Although 'Yucatan Princess' prefers afternoon shade, it can also be grown in full sun. Plant height can reach 80 cm.



Alocasia sarawakensis 'Yucatan Queen'

The Princess of Yucatan ('Yucatan Princess') now has a partner in the Masquerade™ series, namely the Queen of Yucatan ('Yucatan Queen'). This alocase has a very bushy habit, especially if grown in containers. **The very shiny, metallic-effect leaves of this alocase**, are tinted hunter green, a deep, elegant dark green coloration. As the leaves unfurl, they take on a nuanced shade of chocolate purple. The leaves are also wavy and contrast well with the cream-colored stems, which are speckled with blackish purple. The plant can reach 80 to 90 cm in height.

Alocasia sinuata

syn. 'Quilted Dreams', L'alcasé courbé / plié

The thick leaf of this alocase resembles a fluffy comforter due to the embossed texture of its green leaves, which swell its surface, hence the English expression "Quilted Dreams". This selection is reminiscent of alocase 'Dragon Scale', but smaller. When the new leaves unfurl, its dark-green cracked veins contrast with the bright green hue of its leaves. The green-black leaves measure 20 to 25 cm in length. The plant can reach 35 cm in height. This species is a prime candidate for indoor cultivation. **Very original.**

Alocasia wentii

This plant is native to the mountains of New Guinea. The mid-green of the leaf tops contrasts nicely with the metallic purple-bronze underside. The distinctive veins of the 40-50 cm-long leaves enhance this duality of colors. The rhizomes of this species are highly resistant to cold, making this alocase a good candidate for cold regions. In fact, it's often nicknamed "hardy elephant ear" because of its resistance to cold. The plant can reach 80 to 90 cm in height. It grows moderately fast. **Alocase performs well in cool conditions.**





▣ *Alocasia zebrina* 'Tigrina'

Zebra alocase

The trade name for this alocase applies to a specific mutation of the species whose stems are strongly streaked obliquely with brown. These make an excellent focal point in a pot arrangement or flower bed. Its narrow, arrowhead-shaped leaves point upwards, and are leathery and bright green in color. This selection can reach 70 to 90 cm in height. The species is endemic to the Philippines and grows in low to medium-altitude tropical forests. **Curious and original.**



▣ *Alocasia* 'Black Velvet'

syn. 'Black Velvet', 'Little Queen'

This little jewel comes from Borneo and was first described in 1998 under the scientific name of *It's* a small plant that can reach 30 to 35 cm. It does not tolerate temperatures below 13°C and grows in less light than other alocases, making it perfect for indoors. The leaves are heart-shaped, but slightly elongated, with a lovely velvety texture. The name of this selection evokes the dark green, almost black color of its leaves. Its silvery-white veins create a beautiful contrast with the dark color of the leaf top. The back has a reddish tone when the leaves are mature. It's the magic of cultured tissue reproduction that makes this plant available on the market. **Breathtaking leaves... indoors.**



Alocasia 'Borneo King'

This selection is the result of a very complex series of hybridizations. It can grow to over 1.2 to 1.5 m in our northern climate under good growing conditions. The size of this giant elephant's ear can be compared to that of the large-rooted alocase 'Borneo Giant' ('Borneo Giant'). Its leaves are very large and erect, almost straight, as are the petioles. As the leaves mature, they tend to undulate and become slightly waffled. Those who like large, exotic leaves will be well served with this cultivar. It performs best in a sheltered spot. **Good resistance to cool temperatures.**



Alocasia 'Calidora'

Alocase 'Calidora' forms an upright plant with elegant sagittate leaves, up to 70 cm long and 50 cm wide. The leaves are more erect than those of most other alocases. Its prominent light-green veins contrast well with the mid-green of its leaves. Calidora' can reach heights of 90-120 cm and widths of 60-90 cm. It has excellent resistance to wind and cool temperatures. In traditional alocases, it's a sure bet. **A classic in demand.**



Alocasia 'Dark Star'

Its strength lies in its tall, purple-purple stems, which contrast nicely with the foliage. Its large, upright, almost giant, medium-green, glossy leaves are interspersed with very dark, almost black, raised veins. The plant can easily reach 1 to 1.2 m in our northern climate, with good growing conditions in the ground and even in containers. This cultivar is the result of a complex cross between four alocase selections, the aim of which was to obtain an alocase comparable to 'Borneo King' but more resistant to cold, making it an ideal candidate for the Quebec climate like 'Odora' and 'Borneo Giant'. This star plant combines the decorative qualities of several cultivars. **A strong contrast of colors ...**

This alocase is a hybrid that resembles the long-lobed alocase with its dark green, almost black leaves, accented with silvery-white veins. With age, the plant sports dark ebony stems that add a mysterious accent to this plant, which can be grown indoors or in a shady area of the garden. 'Ebony' can reach 60 cm in height.

N *Alocasia* 'Golden Dragon'

This hybrid between the large-rooted alocase 'Lutea' ('Lutea') and the alocase 'Sarian' ('Sarian') has inherited the best aspects of both its parents: beautiful spring-green leaves with a midrib and veins that turn golden yellow with age, burgundy-speckled stems against a yellow background and, last but not least, its prehistoric-looking, sharply-cut leaves. The plant can reach 80 cm in height. **An astonishing selection to make you dream.**



N *Alocasia* 'Hilo Beauty'

One of the most interesting alocases to add an exotic and original touch, both in the garden and in the home, with its unique, elegant foliage that has a downy appearance. The leaf of 'Hilo Beauty' is reminiscent of a camouflage outfit, with shades of pale white and lime green running through the leaf, accompanied by creamy yellow to white speckled spots. The plant's brownish-green stems, sprinkled with dark-brown spots, create a striking contrast with its handsome panicle leaves. The underside of the leaf takes on a light burgundy color. This alocase can reach heights of 45 to 75 cm, with good basal branching. **Contrasting and unique.**

N **Alocasia 'Imperial Red'**

Alocase 'Imperial Red', a hybrid between 'Odora' and a selection of the large-rooted alocase with pink stems. It is distinguished from its congeners by its long, purplish-red petioles, which give off a luminous effect that doesn't go unnoticed and is reminiscent of red-stemmed rhubarb. This sure value makes a great focal point in a tall container, as it adds dynamism with the marked contrast between its purplish-red stems and its strongly erect green leaves. The plant can reach heights of 90 to 110 cm. **Spectacular effect guaranteed.**



Deep. chic **N** **Alocasia 'Ivory Coast'**

The leaves of this hybrid, which can reach 60 to 80 cm in height, are quite large, reaching 30 cm in length in good growing conditions. The dark-green leaves are criss-crossed with highly visible silver-green veins shaded with white. When mature, the stems take on a light pink color that blends pleasantly with the slightly dark green of the leaves. **The tropics in your home.**



Alocasia 'Kuching Mask'

A few years ago, during an expedition to Borneo, the renowned collector and hybridizer of exotic plants, Brian Williams, visited the city of Kuching in Malaysia. In Malay dialect, the name of the city means "cat". Therefore, when he selected one of his hybridizations and noticed that its glossy, deeply lobed leaves resembled "cat ears", he decided to name it after the city he had enjoyed so much. The truly spectacular dark green leaves of 'Kuching Mask' are accentuated by white veins, giving it an original appearance. The undersides of the leaves are colored in dark brown and gray, with pale green veins. The petioles are striped with dark gray and pink. This particular cultivar can reach a height of 80 to 100 cm at maturity, with a spread ranging from 70 to 90 cm. It is an easy-to-grow selection..

Alocasia 'Maharani'

syn. 'Grey Dragon'

Better known as "Grey Dragon", this charming and highly original plant is a rare, dwarf selection resulting from a cross between alocasia petite reine and alocasia 'Melo'. 'Maharani' or 'Grey Dragon' is prized for its thick, gray-green leaves, which are highly textured and rough to the touch, with a texture similar to 'Black Velvet' and 'Frydek'. Its downy leaves are so stiff they look like plastic. The backs of the leaves turn from light green to a slightly reddish hue. Its light-green stems are small and slender. This plant is ideal for growing in containers for both indoor and outdoor planting. It reaches a height of 35 to 40 cm.





Alocasia 'Mayan Mask'

This Alocasia, another exquisite selection from the renowned hybridizer Brian Williams' Masquerade™ hybrids, features large glossy dark green leaves with green veins. The undersides of the leaves are dark brown in color. The stems are very strong and vigorous, giving a well-upright posture to the fleshy leaves of this tropical beauty. As the plant matures, the leaves ascend, forming an elegant curvature that allows young leaves to emerge from the center. The leaf edges are serrated. This vigorous plant can easily reach heights of 70 to 90 cm and widths of 60 to 80 cm. 'Mayan Mask', the sibling of 'Kuching Mask', is named after its resemblance to the design of a Mayan mask, fittingly part of the Masquerade™ series.

Alocasia 'Melino'

The new leaves of this Alocasia are tinted with dark purple, almost **metallic black-brown**, while older leaves turn into shades of pale purple-green. The undersides of the leaves, deeply veined, remain violet-black throughout the season, contrasting well with the greenish color on the upper side of the leaves. These leaves are supported by long, fleshy, robust stems that are violet-black in color. The silhouette of this Alocasia is very erect, with a slightly spreading form. The plant can reach heights of 1 to 1.2 meters. **This selection surpasses 'Dark Star' in terms of the metallic aspect of its foliage. A winner in every aspect.**



Alocasia 'Portora'

syn. 'Portidora', 'Portadora'

This alocase is a hybrid between alocase odorant and alocase de Porte. It forms a spectacular, upright clump that can reach 90 to 120 cm in height and 60 to 90 cm in width. Its large, heavily-veined, wavy, toothed green leaves are supported by sturdy, purple-colored stems. This selection thrives best in good light and part shade. Soil should be rich in organic matter but well drained. **A standard with added value.**



Alocasia 'Regal Shields'

Alocase 'Regal Shields' is a selection obtained by sowing following a cross between fragrant alocase and alocase 'Black Velvet' ('Black Velvet'). The top of the leaf has a satiny, almost black sheen, and the back is tinged reddish-brown with soft green main veins. The plant forms a relatively small rosette that can reach 60 to 70 cm in height. Satiny velvet appearance.

Alocasia 'Sarian'

This reptilian plant adds a prehistoric impact to flowerbeds and container arrangements. The triangular, brick-brown spots on the stems are reminiscent of reptile scales. Darker at the base of the plant, their color fades as they climb the stem. The prominent white veins of its long triangular leaves contrast well with the dark green color of the leaf. The leaves point skywards, giving the plant a singular physiognomy and making it appear tall. The plant can reach 80-90 cm in height. Sarian' grows in full sun. This selection is a hybrid between zebra alocase and Micholitz alocase. **A spiky plant.**



Alocasia 'Serendipity'

The dark green leaves of this colocase have purple highlights, and the backs of the leaves are purple-brown. Visible purplish-beige veins streak the back of the leaf. Olive-green veins run along the top of the leaf. Petioles are mottled purple-brown on a lime-green background. This cultivar is more robust and easier to grow than classic alocases. The plant can reach 70-80 cm in height, especially if grown in filtered sunlight. It was bred by the same hybridizer who produced 'Regal Shields' and 'Low Rider'.



Alocasia 'Sumo'

'Sumo' is a cross between the alocase 'Portora' and the premier alocase 'Purple Cloak' (Alocasia princeps 'Purple Cloak'), which produces large, dark-green leaves with a bronze tinge and purplish veins on the back. Its colors become more defined as the plant matures. Dark purple petioles add a great deal of charm to this tropical plant, which can reach 1.2 to 1.3 m in height and 90 to 110 cm in width. **A giant in the making: fast-growing with very large leaves.**

Alocasia 'Tiny Dancers'

2009 International Aroid Society Award

In 2009, this plant won the prize for most unusual aroid at the International Aroid Society's annual exhibition. The tiny dancers of Elton John's song, "Tiny Dancers", are in fact its bright green, cup-shaped leaves that transport us into an imaginary world. Small, they only reach 30 to 35 cm in length. Even in its early stages of growth, 'Tiny Dancers' is magnificent on the terrace or as a centerpiece in a decorative pot. It can take center stage on its own or with complementary plants such as succulents. The plant, which has good basal branching, can reach 30-35 cm in height. **Finesse and lightness.**

This small aloe has very festive colors: its green succulent leaves have raised spots of dark crimson tinged with brilliant red. This succulent plant forms a rosette of leaves and produces small pink to red flowers in late summer. It is drought-tolerant and can be used in small container arrangements around the house. This plant can reach 15 to 25 cm (6 to 10 in.) in height and width. Aloe 'Christmas Carol' is best grown indoors on a bright windowsill. It's bred by renowned aloe hybridizer Kelly Griffin. It is one of the most popular aloe hybrids.



Alpinia zerumbet 'Variegata'

Zerumbet alpinia with variegated foliage

This variation of zerumbet alpinia forms a clump of elongated, irregularly striped cream and yellow leaves that look very much like a feather. Its bright variegated foliage is ideal for brightening up a darker area of the garden. The plant can reach 60 cm in height and spread. This plant is ideal for large container arrangements. Used on its own, it should be grown in subdued sunlight. Splendidly bright.

Alstroemeria serie Colorita®... A revelation !

With the Colorita® concept, Dutch breeder Royal Van Zanten wanted to show the explosion of color possibilities of these plants.

These hybrids come back to life after the first flowering, with umbels of striated flowers crowning the sturdy stems with generosity right up to the big frosts. In autumn, these hybrids are an excellent replacement for many autumn-flowering plants. Plants can measure 30 to 35 cm in height and width.



Alstroemeria Colorita® Claire®

This selection from the Colorita® series has green foliage and pure white flowers with no markings in the throat. This distinguishes it from Claressa®, which has a yellowish center on variegated foliage. Claire® can reach 25 to 35 cm in height and 30 cm in width.



Alstroemeria Colorita® Claressa®

Claressa® is naturally compact and forms an attractive mound. Its highly decorative leaves are tinged with shades of green, with golden-yellow to white margins. This hybrid produces white flowers with yellowish centers. It blooms throughout the summer and produces a beautiful autumn display. Claressa® can reach heights of 25 to 30 cm and widths of 30 to 35 cm.



Alstroemeria Colorita® Katiana®

This attractive plant transforms terraces and gardens into a colorful party. The plant, with its variegated green and white foliage, forms a compact, colorful mound 25 to 30 cm high and 30 to 35 cm wide. It produces a red flower with a small yellowish throat.

Alstroemeria Colorita® Lisa®

The Colorita® Lisa® selection is the most floriferous of the series, flowering continuously from spring to frost. It produces bright yellow flowers with very few spots and pale green tips. The plant is vigorous, easily reaching 30 cm in height and at least 35 cm in width. **This plant is sure to become the star of your flowerbed.**



Alstroemeria Colorita® Yenti® ‘Yenti’

This alstroemeria produces vibrant violet flowers with deep red throats, a bold, vivid color. The plant forms a compact mound 30 to 35 cm high and wide.





Alstroemeria Little Miss Zoe® 'Zoe'

Little Miss Zoe® alstroemeria

This alstroemeria cultivar is a dwarf selection with variable variegation of dark green, soft green and predominantly lime. The lime-green leaves turn white on the flowering stem. The plant of this cool-loving alstroemeria forms a small, compact dome, and its variegated texture is reminiscent of a miniature hosta. Its rhizomatous root system is very aggressive. From late spring to October, Little Miss Zoe® produces flowers with six reddish-orange petals, three of which are speckled with black and two of which have golden-yellow centers. The spring bloom is slightly repeated, with a peak in autumn. The contrast between the color of the flowers and the hue of its foliage is very attractive: a single flower is enough to enliven its variegations. This selection is hardy and easy to grow, especially if given deep, fertile, well-drained soil, in full sun to part shade. It gives an original, decorative touch throughout the summer, in containers or in the ground. The plant can reach 20 cm in height and 25 cm in width.

Alstroemeria Rock 'n' Roll® 'Aldun01'

In 2017, it was the favorite of the public on the Exceptionnelles® site. This alstroemeria, a tissue mutation of the 'Red Baron' cultivar, can be grown in both sun and semi-shade. The sun does not damage its incredible variegated foliage, which changes from white to cream and yellow. This is edged and sometimes striped with dark green. When the flowers appear, in addition to the decorative foliage which stands on its own, usually at the end of July, it's the apotheosis. The deep orange-red flowers of Rock 'n' Roll® are striped with yellow and measure between 5 and 6 cm in diameter. They contrast nicely not only with the foliage, but also with the whitish stems. The umbel measures 10 to 15 cm in diameter. The plant can reach 45 to 60 cm in height and 40 to 50 cm in width. It grows in well-drained, slightly moist but not soggy soil, rich in organic matter. This alstroemeria is resistant to disease and insects. **Spectacular.**



Asparagus densiflorus 'Myers'

Dense-flowered Myers asparagus, Tufted Myers asparagus, Myers asparagus, 'Myers' asparagus fern

The pale green, cat-tail-shaped shoots of this ornamental asparagus resemble ferns. The plant's habit is rigid and upright. Its foliage, made up of fine, flattened needles, is bushy. In fact, the species name, , refers to its dense foliage. Tiny white flowers appear in early summer, followed by small red berries. The slow-growing plant forms a mound that can reach 25 to 30 cm in height and spread. It is fairly heat-tolerant. This cultivar has several names in horticultural literature: 'Meyeri', 'Meyers', 'Myers' and 'Myersii'.



Deep chic Apoballis acuminatissima 'Lavallaei'

Formerly listed in the genus Schismatoglottis and sometimes sold commercially as Homalomena 'Purple Sword', the very pointed apoballe 'Lavallaei' is an excellent colorful addition to any indoor space. The foliage of this easy-to-cultivate tropical plant is made up of pointed, dark-green leaves, spotted irregularly with grayish-white. The underside of the elliptical leaves is wine-red. The plant develops bright red stems. This fun plant loves warmth and humidity. The plant can reach 30 cm in height. A horticultural star.



Asparagus setaceus

Feathery asparagus

Native to South Africa, this herbaceous plant is grown as an annual in our climate. It forms an evergreen bush. Its great decorative value lies in its fine, feathery foliage. Feather asparagus needs rich soil, so a good compost is beneficial. Best grown in part shade, but can tolerate sun. The plant is very vigorous and can reach 45 to 60 cm in height. **Aggressive and vaporous.**

Canna Alaska®

This canna produces ivory-white to pale yellow flowers measuring 10 to 22 cm in diameter, set off by large green foliage. This canna's whitish bloom sets off red flowers like those of Fire Dragon® canna, and its green foliage contrasts well with dark foliage like 'Australia'. The plant can measure 1 to 1.2 m in height and 45 to 60 cm in spread. This canna's greater basal development is due to the fact that it is propagated by tissue culture. **The whitest canna ...**





Canna 'Blueberry Sparkler'

Those who love the slender appearance of canna 'Intrigue' will be delighted by this graceful, pink-blooming canna. Its robust, medium-sized flowers are a bonus to its magnificent purple foliage tinged with blue-gray. The bluish underside of the leaves completes the picture. The plant can reach 1.5 to 2 m in height and 60 to 70 cm in width. **Unique appearance ... An architectural silhouette in the vertical ... One of the tallest on the market ...**



Canna 'Australia'

The glossy, fluted leaves of this cultivar come in dark shades of brown, burgundy, black and bronze. What's more, the foliage retains its spectacular colors throughout the summer. Its large, wavy, luminous flowers, a successful marriage of brilliant red and flamboyant orange, are an added treat. This hybrid is a flamboyant addition to the garden, as an isolated plant or in association. It can be grown directly in water, at planting depths ranging from 5 to 20 cm. This selection, from the canna 'Cleopatra', forms a particularly vigorous plant. Its paddle-shaped foliage is very spreading. Its large, very dark leaves have a burgundy-brown color. Its flowering presents large flamboyant flowers, brightly colored orange-red. Its flowers are larger than those of 'Cleopatra'. Flowering is very good for a canna with dark foliage. This large canna can reach between 1.5 and 2 m in height. It needs warmth and sun to develop well, in rich and light soil. **A giant in itself... Among the large cannas with bronze foliage, it is the most efficient...**

THE Elite™ SERIES CANNAS

This collection of cannas includes small to medium sized cultivars, unique and flamboyant colors.

Canna Elite™ Chocolate Sunrise®

This canna is characterized by a compact habit, dark foliage draped in chocolate and purple as well as very luminous flowering reminiscent of the gold of an egg yolk. The height of the plant can vary between 70 to 80 cm and its spread between 45 to 60 cm.





Canna Elite™ Moonshine

The cultivar name, “moonbeam,” describes this canna well, as it is one of the whitest flowers in the world of cannas. Its flower is white with cream and pale salmon shades. It creates a nice contrast with the shiny green foliage. A height of between 1 to 1.2 m is to be expected and a spread of between 50 and 60 cm.

Canna Elite™ Orange Chocolate®

Elite™ Orange Chocolate® is characterized by its relatively dwarf size, reaching only 75 to 90 cm in height and a spread of 45 to 60 cm. Its foliage is colored chocolate purple. It produces orange flowers that open vertically and contrast beautifully with its dark foliage. **A perfect size for arrangements containing...**



Canna Elite™ Starship®

This vigorous canna can reach 110 cm in height. Its bright yellow flowers are heavily tinged with dark red spots like a leopard. The foliage is green. The growth of the plant is rapid. **One of the most beautiful on the market with its luminous flower and its shape...**



Canna 'Fogo Sunset'

This canna produces bright orange flowers carried by very large stems. These contrast well with its large purple leaves tinged with green. The plant is robust and can reach 90 to 120 cm and 60 to 80 cm in width. The development of this canna resembles that of 'Fire Dragon'. **A very aggressive canna...with a unique...bright orange bloom.**

Canna Fire Dragon® 'JC2-12'

Fire Dragon® produces large, velvety red flowers, very bright on green leaves. Once established, the length of the inflorescence of this canna regularly exceeds 30 to 40 cm. Probably the most beautiful canna with red flowers on green foliage. The flowers are self-cleaning. This strongly spreading canna can easily reach 1.2 m in height and 75 to 90 cm in width. The most flamboyant of reds... according to Monsieur DECO-Style®. **The Magnificent... An aggressive and unique dragon... The champion in red...**



The Cannas of the Island series

The Island series cannas bring together cannas that generally “tall” exceptionally well. Thus, they emit several secondary stems which grow from the primary stem. These prolific shoots don't take long to flower, allowing for multiple flower stems at once. The plants, with green foliage, are strong and robust. Often three stems in flower buds prepare to take over from the faded stems. Flowering is continuous.

Canna ‘Kreta’

This canna produces small, bright red flowers: it is one of the most beautiful reds in the world of small cannas. It can reach 90 to 100 cm in height.



Canna ‘Madeira’

‘Madeira’ produces orange-red flowers with a narrow golden-yellow border. This canna is exceptionally floriferous. Each stem produces three flower clusters consecutively. The plant can easily reach 1 m in height and 50 to 70 cm in spread. Wilted flowers fall off on their own.

A must...

Canna ‘Tenerife’

This canna produces a flower with the same pattern as ‘Starship’, but smaller. The golden orange flower is dotted with orange-red spots. The flower spike is well filled and the flowering is long lasting. The plant can reach 90 to 100 cm in height.



The Cannas from the Punch series

Brian Williams of Brian's Botanicals, a lover of tropical plants and noted hybridizer, introduced cannas in a series he called Punch. These cannas are compact, making them ideal for today's gardens and container arrangements. They have a long flowering time and very colorful flowers, which offer us a cocktail of exotic colors.

They are easy to grow and the flowers are self-cleaning.



Canna 'Lemon Punch'

'Lemon Punch' offers the same floribundness as its predecessor 'Orange Punch' with curved lemon-yellow flowers lightly dusted with orange. The bloom is self-cleaning. Compact in shape, this canna can reach 90 to 100 cm in height and 60 to 75 cm in width in good growing conditions. **A pioneer in the world of yellow-flowered cannas. A plant sun... a champion.**



Canna 'Maui Punch'

This other representative of the Punch series features bright green leaves which create a very successful contrast with its large golden yellow flowers heavily dotted with orange-red spots. This canna, with a compact shape, can reach 70 to 90 cm in height. This selection is easy to grow and maintain like its counterparts.



Canna 'Orange Punch'

This canna forms a compact plant, reaching 80 to 100 cm in height and 45 to 60 cm in width. It is considered a medium sized canna. 'Orange Punch' can therefore easily be grown in containers on terraces. No one is insensitive to the charm of the generous flowering of this hybrid, which produces beautiful bright orange flowers, speckled in the center with brilliant yellow, luminous colors which contrast pleasantly with its green, oval and lanceolate leaves. The flowers, very original, resemble monarch butterflies grouped in clusters hanging from the top of the stems. The drooping habit of the flowers is due to one of its relatives, the iris-flowered canna. **A winner ...**

Canna 'Pretoria'

Award of Garden Merit of the RHS

This canna features some of the most beautiful variegated foliage in the canna world. The foliage of this canna, which evokes the coat of the Bengal tiger, is streaked with successive yellow and green bands. It produces a bright orange flower, 8 to 10 cm in diameter, carried by an orange-red stem. Its height varies between 1.2 and 1.5 m and its width is approximately 60 to 80 cm. Very vigorous selection... Very popular and widely used canna. **A top seller...**

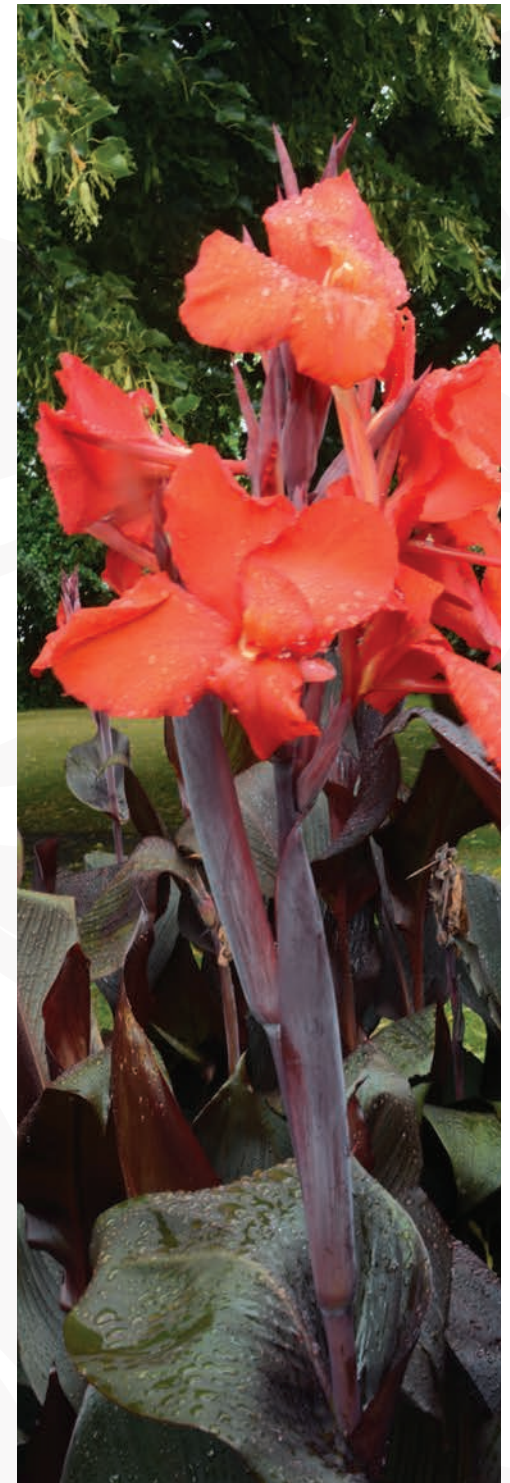




Canna 'Red Velvet Africa'

This canna, with decorative foliage, produces fiery red flowers which contrast nicely with its purple to brown foliage. This selection can reach 1.2 m in height. The formation of new shoots at the base is very good. 'Red Velvet Africa' can be placed alongside 'Pretoria' canna to create a striking contrast.

The Cannas from the South Pacific series

The South Pacific series from Japanese hybridizer Takii was once again awarded an All-America Selections award for 2018 with the selection 'South Pacific Orange', after earning this honor in 2013 with the cultivar 'South Pacific Scarlet'. Two other cultivars are available in the series, 'South Pacific Rose' and 'South Pacific Ivory'. Their height can vary between 70 to 80 cm. The South Pacific series is superior to the Tropical series.



Canna 'South Pacific Ivory'

This canna adds an exotic touch to the garden with its ivory flower. Its creamy white is refined and gives high clarity color without blemish. Its subtle and gentle flowering enhances somewhat dull arrangements, both in flowerbeds and in container arrangements. It can also go well with all the other shades that we want to combine with it.



Canna 'South Pacific Orange'

All-America Selections 2018

This canna with a compact shape is suitable for both landscaping and growing in containers. If we compare it to other cannas in its category, it is more vigorous, more uniform and develops better basal branching than its congeners. The plant can reach 1 m in height and 45 to 60 cm in spread. Its bright orange flowering color contrasts nicely with its glossy dark green foliage. Its flowers measure 10 cm in diameter and 'South Pacific Orange' has a long flowering time. Its flowering naturally attracts pollinators who will feast on the nectar of its flowers. As this canna comes from seedlings, it is less likely to be affected by diseases than if it came from bulbs. Its hybridizer, Takii & Co. Ltd., is an expert in cannas that offers high-performance cultivars.



Canna 'South Pacific Rose'

The beautiful pink flower of this canna brings a delicate touch of femininity to the atmosphere of the gardens. It's a nice alternative to bright colors, which goes very well with greenery. As white is the natural ally of pink, do not hesitate to plant a canna with white flowers nearby. It's up to you to take advantage of the unlimited potential of 'South Pacific Rose' by having fun creating romance in your arrangements in the ground and in containers.



Canna 'South Pacific Scarlet' **All-America Selections 2013**

'South Pacific Scarlet' canna adds a distinctive exotic touch to the garden, with its 10cm diameter scarlet tropical flower. What mainly distinguishes this spectacularly flowering canna from its peers is that it is the first F1 hybrid grown from seed. This particularity makes it a robust plant, very floriferous, throughout the summer season. 'South Pacific Scarlet' flowers a week earlier than other cannas on the market, flowers longer and develops good basal branching. It was the Japanese company Takii that obtained this canna.



Canna Tropicanna®

As the leaves of this selection unfold, they show a golden green central vein, which mixes with dark burgundy. A combination of dark red, pink, yellow, gold and green subsequently appears, forming irregular streaks. The very rigid stems support its large orange tangerine flower. Tropicanna® can reach a height of 90 to 100 cm and a spread of 60 cm. Its growth rate is moderately rapid.

Canna Tropicanna® Black 'Lon01'

The dark bronze to chocolate leaves of Tropicanna® Black resemble those of 'Ebony Patra' canna. They are so dark that the veins become invisible. It produces vermilion red flowers. The height of this prince of darkness can vary between 1.2 and 1.8 m. This selection shows very aggressive growth. **By far the most imposing of the series... The Black Prince... A TOP seller.**

Canna Tropicanna® Gold 'Mactro'

This canna from the Tropicanna® series features magnificent green foliage ribbed with yellow. Its terminal orange inflorescence, with a broad golden yellow border, contrasts well with the colors of its striped foliage. Wilted flowers fall naturally. This canna has no equal when it comes to accentuating the exotic effect of a flowery pot. It can reach 1.2 to 1.5 m in height and 60 to 90 cm in width. This fast-growing plant is very vigorous. **The light of the series... A TOP seller.**



Carex buchananii 'Red Rooster'

Buchanan's laïche

Buchanan's sedge 'Red Rooster' has fine orange-brown to copper-bronze foliage. These colors, more intense than those of the species, give this cultivar a very original "dried plant" appearance. This graceful, upright grass forms a mass of vase-shaped leaves 50 to 60 cm high and wide. 'Red Rooster' can grow in the sun or in light shade. This cultivar is hardy to zone 4. The species is native to New Zealand.



Carex elata 'Aurea'

('Bowles Golden')

The golden raised sedge

The foliage of this grass has a beautiful bright golden yellow with two small green margins on each side of the leaf, which brings lots of brightness to the garden. The plant gives flowers in the form of very fine brown spikes in spring. This perennial grass develops a rounded tuft which can reach 40 to 50 cm in height and width. It grows in rich, moist soil, but tolerates dry soil well. It can be grown in sun, partial shade or shade. This perennial grass is hardy to zone 4.



Carex comans 'Amazon Mist'

The tufted sedge

This grass forms a hairy fountain of silver-green leaves 30 to 35 cm high and 30 to 40 cm wide. The ends of its thin, arching leaves are curled. 'Amazon Mist' grows in full sun, in moist but well-drained soil. It can be planted in a group in a flower bed or as a trailing plant in the edges of containers.



N Centaurea 'Mercury'

The centaury

A perfect plant for lovers of decorative leaves and is ideal for highlighting other colors in container arrangements and flower beds. Its long, grayish, luminous leaves are serrated and wavy. They have rounded lobes and are arranged in tight rosettes. The silvery white color is stable and uniform throughout the season. The plant forms a mound, with a compact shape, 30 cm high and 40 cm wide. It performs equally well in full sun or shade and is known to be deer resistant. Its silky appearance can be used to give added value in container combinations, in flowerbed borders, in rockeries and in group plantings. **The ideal plant to highlight its congeners... A plant very resistant to diseases and insects... A UNIQUE SHAPE... A truly exceptional plant... A TOP seller...**

Chlorophytum saundersiae 'Starlight'

Saunders' chlorophyte

This selection, which comes from a native plant very popular in South Africa, is related to the indoor plant called spider plant. But unlike this one, its shape is erect. 'Starlight' was selected as one of the top 20 plants in 2019 at the Chelsea Flower Show. It offers both the light appearance of a grass and a beautiful green and white variegation that can brighten up container arrangements and flower beds. Its variegation develops both in the sun and in partial shade where it brightens up slightly dark corners. This chlorophyte produces a constellation of white flowers with six star-shaped petals that dance above the foliage. The flower stem is "albino," being devoid of chlorophyll. The seeds are sterile. This plant grows well in cool, rich soil and can reach 80 to 90 cm in height.

N Clematis Little Lemons 'Zo14100'

This very hardy mini clematis, which belongs to the Tangutica group, was selected for its exceptional dwarfism, its long flowering period from early summer until late autumn and its feathery fruiting heads which last for a couple of weeks. Its lemon yellow flowers, shaped like a hanging bell, measure 2 to 3 cm in diameter. This clematis can be used in containers and in flower beds. Little Lemons can reach 25 to 35 cm in height and 50 cm in width. **Original and exceptional.**



Clematis Taiga®

Plantarium 2016: silver medal and Press prize.

Medium in size, the very double and particularly attractive flower of this clematis, equal to no other, measures 6 to 10 cm in diameter and opens from a greenish flower bud. Smaller petals, tinted with purple, green and purplish blue, form an astonishing bouquet in the center of the flower, a true work of art. This contrasts nicely with the six larger petals which appeared at the start of flowering and which form a collar which remains purple throughout flowering. The design of this refined flower is reminiscent of a dahlia cactus. This clematis flowers in mid-June. In one season, this climbing plant with twining stems can reach 1 to 1.2 m in height and 50 to 60 cm in width. It is modest in stature but grows quickly. It is perfect for growing in containers and in the ground. Finally, its cultivation is easy. We recommend not pruning it during the dormant period, because it often grows back on old wood.: **this clematis is hardy up to zone 3. A revelation...**



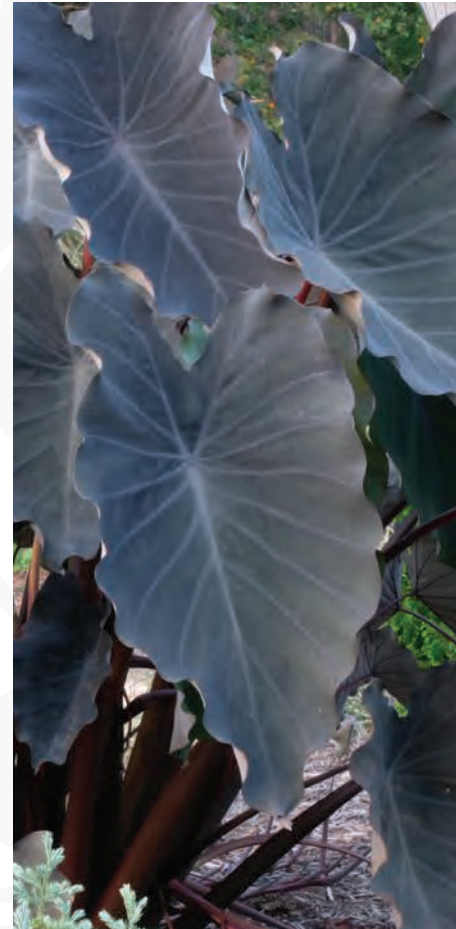
Colocasia esculenta 'Black Magic'

'Black Magic' is the truly successful precursor to dark-leaved colocaceae. It has dark plum leaves that can measure up to 60 cm in length and 45 cm in width. Their border is slightly wavy which gives them a special character. The leaves are borne on a long purple petiole. The height and width of this colocase can vary between 90 to 100 cm.



Colocasia esculenta 'Black Beauty'

Introduced in 2006, this mutation of the edible colocasia 'Illustris', presents burgundy-black leaves, darker than these. The green veins of this beautiful aroid have also almost disappeared. This spectacular plant seems straight from the world of Alice in Wonderland. These are the kind of plants that speak to the imagination: in one season you can create a spectacular scene with this star plant. 'Black Beauty' can reach 100 cm in height. Although this plant requires light, it performs well in shady situations.

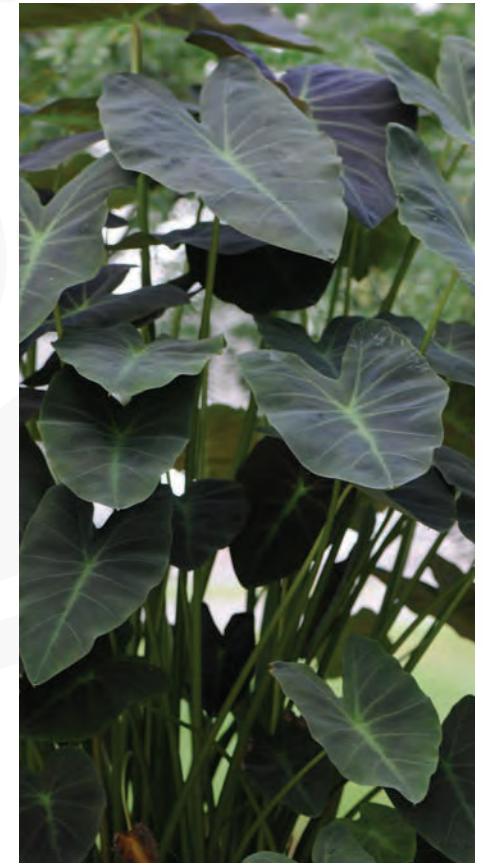


Colocasia esculenta 'Coal Miner'

This colocasia is suitable, like all its congeners, for sunny gardens and shade gardens. It is a version almost similar to the 'Illustris' selection, sporting large heart-shaped veined blackish leaves, tinged with green, but larger in size. The plant, with a rather erect habit, can reach 90 to 130 cm in height. The underside of the leaves also differs being dark olive rather than medium green. The leaves look best in the sun.

Colocasia esculenta 'Black Runner'

This colocase which is probably a mutation of the popular 'Black Magic' presents leaves 60 cm long which emerge with a green color much more nuanced with black-purple than 'Black Magic'. These turn coal black when ripe. The edges of the leaves are also more wrinkled. The petioles are dark burgundy. The plant emits runners that crawl along the ground, resembling snakes, another difference and probably the most striking. 'Black Runner' can reach 1 to 1.2 m in height.





Colocasia esculenta 'Jack's Giant'

This colocasia, as its name indicates, is one of the large colocasis. The petioles are green and support its large leaves which can measure 80 to 100 cm in length. The growth of this selection is very rapid, the plant being able to reach this optimal height in one season. This is an excellent plant for those growing in colder regions. The plant can reach 1.2 to 1.5 m in height.



Colocasia esculenta 'Illustris'

If you want a plant with an imposing look and a tropical appearance to create a surprise effect or to give relief to a portion of the garden, you can opt for the edible colocaceae 'Illustris'. This cultivar can reach 90 to 120 cm in height and 60 to 90 cm in width. Its large, heart-shaped black leaves, which can measure 60 cm by 30 cm, are tinged with brilliant green. They look best under the sun.



Colocasia esculenta 'Mojito'

A very original elephant ear, which adds color and texture to a body of water, a flower bed or a flower pot. This Cuban cocktail of chartreuse leaves, speckled with dark purple spots, should be served in all public or private gardens to refresh them in midsummer. Even its stems streaked with burgundy purple are decorative. This colocasia can reach 80 to 90 cm in height and width.



Colocasia esculenta Royal Hawaiian® Aloha

This colocase has a very well balanced bushy habit. Its large dark plum leaves tinged with pale green are adorned with a light green central vein which creates a beautiful contrast. The plant can reach 1 to 1.3 m in height and 75 to 90 cm in width.



Colocasia esculenta Royal Hawaiian® Black Coral

The basal branching of this selection is the fastest in the world of colocaceae and thus presents a unique density. A specimen that lends itself well to growing in containers, but also to flower beds, both in the shade and in the sun. It performs very well in cool temperatures. **One of the most beautiful with a compact port...**



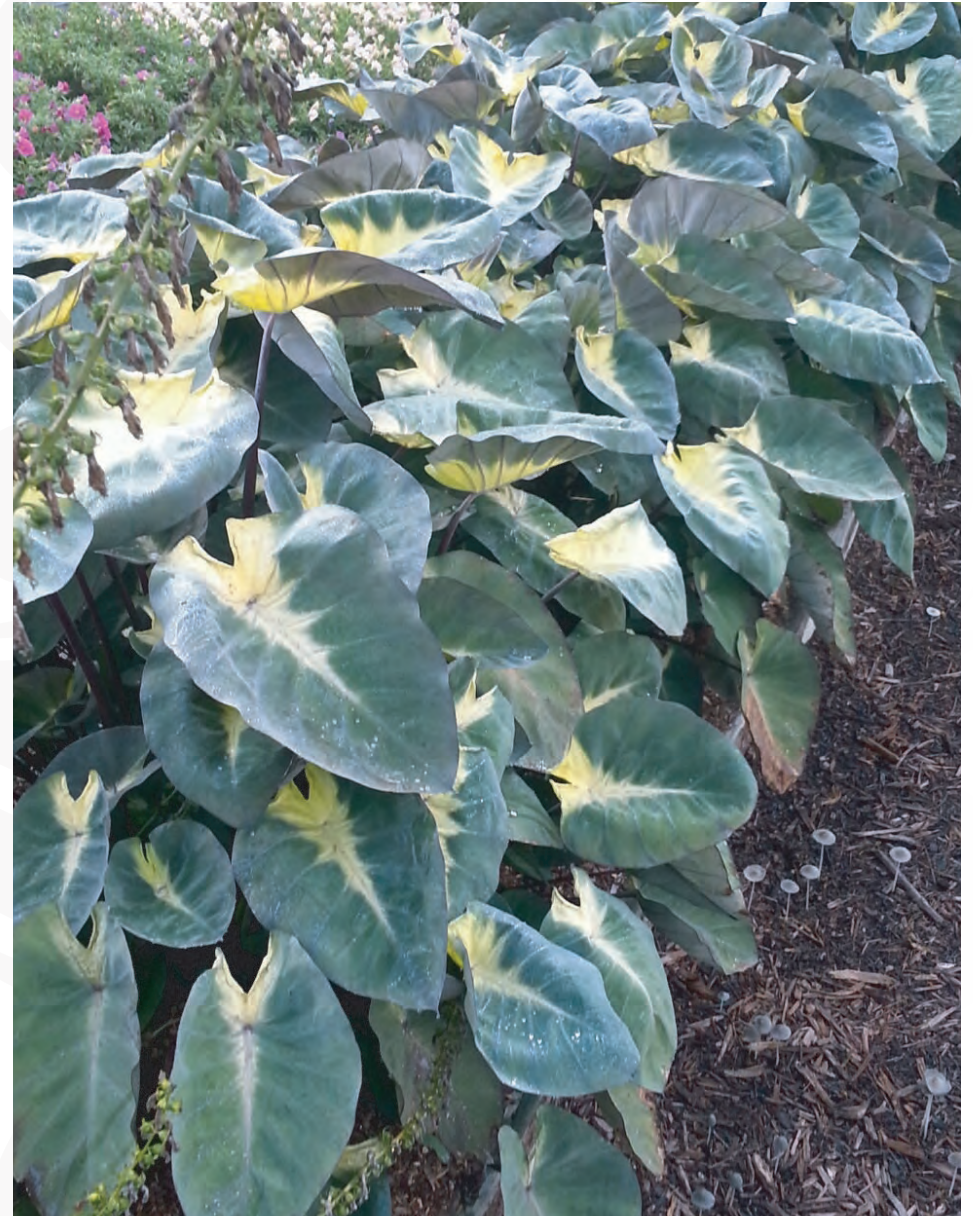
Colocasia esculenta Royal Hawaiian® Maui Gold

This fast-growing cultivar features a well-balanced silhouette of textured golden chartreuse leaves carried by ivory-white stems. A purple dot appears on the leaf, where it is connected to the petiole. Its leaves do not burn in the sun or under high temperatures. This colocasia can reach 80 to 100 cm in height. **The best colocasis with yellow foliage...**



Colocasia esculenta Royal Hawaiian® Tropical Storm

This selection forms a well-branched and very compact plant. The creamy white band which radiates in the lateral veins of the small dark leaves becomes quite significant on the fourth and fifth leaves of the plant. This colocasia can reach 60 to 70 cm in height and width. It is smaller in size than the 'White Lava' selection and its leaves are darker and less voluminous. **Very compact...**



Colocasia esculenta Royal Hawaiian® Maui Sunrise

This colocasia is a beautiful addition to the series, with its icy green foliage and a creamy white pattern in the center of the leaf consisting of a median streak from which lateral and **flamboyant** veins branch off at an angle in the leaf. It is a more compact version than Royal Hawaiian® White Lava and it takes on its color earlier in the season. The plant can reach 60 to 80 cm in height. **Adds light to shady areas...**



Colocasia esculenta Royal Hawaiian® White Lava

Its large, green, glazed leaves are embellished in the middle of the season with a wide band of creamy white which radiates in the lateral veins of the leaf. Each leaf is then enhanced by a large purple mark at the leaf attachment. These have a slightly wrinkled shape. The plant can reach 90 to 100 cm in height.



Colocasia esculenta Royal Hawaiian® Waikiki

All-America Selections 2023

The 'Waikiki' selection is an exceptional addition to the Royal Hawaiian® series which has presented us with unprecedented colocaceae in the past. This plant is distinguished by its shiny purplish-pink veins that run through its shiny green foliage and its creamy white band that radiates into the leaf. The leaf petiole is dark burgundy. 'Waikiki' gains its color quickly, even when the plant is juvenile. The plant can reach 90 to 100 cm in height and width.

Colocasia esculenta 'Tea Cup'

This colocasia is appreciated for its dark purple stems and its well erect glazed leaves which give it a straight shape. The shiny olive leaves are upside down forming a cup, hence the name of the cultivar. The spectacle of the sun illuminating the purple of the veins of its leaves completes this enchanting picture. The very lush plant can reach 1 to 1.2 m in height and is narrower than it is tall. **A special and spectacular architecture...**



Colocasia esculenta 'Violet Stem'

This colocase is one of the most versatile: it will bring beauty and balance both in large containers and in a flower bed. 'Violet Stem' is also perfect for bodies of water, when it is well established. This selection is distinguished by its long, moderately thin and graceful dark purple stems which contrast wonderfully with its purplish green leaves. The latter are highlighted by very marked plum-colored veins. The underside of the leaves is purplish. This plant has good basal branching. The plant also emits stolons which crawl on the ground and take root. 'Violet Stem' can reach 80 to 90 cm in height.



Colocasia esculenta 'Tea Party'

The colors of the foliage of this colocase show beautiful hues when the morning or afternoon sun iridescent its cup-shaped black leaves: beautiful shades of red then appear, giving them a lot of shine. Its dark fuchsia stems are also very decorative. 'Tea Party' can reach 80 to 90 cm in height and is narrower than tall. It is slightly more compact than 'Tea Cup'.



Colocasia gigantea 'Thailand Giant'

Colocasia gigantica / giant

Even if this plant reaches 3 m in height in its original habitat, it is content with a height of 1.2 m and a width of 1.5 m in our gardens. The pale green leaves of this aroid, which resembles an alocase, will impress you with their size. This plant is well adapted to almost all light conditions and resists sun well. An excellent focal plant for large spaces, such as municipal developments and parks, as well as for large containers. **A great among the greats, a star among the stars!**



Colocasia 'Black Goblet'

This colocaceae has dark black, cup-shaped, bumpy, wavy leaves. Its leaf is larger than other selections of this type. The blackish color of the leaves brings boldness to a flowerbed or a container arrangement. This exotic plant can easily reach 120 to 140 cm in height. A marvel... in grandeur... **A big brother of 'Tea Cup'...**

N Colocasia 'Pharaoh's Mask'

If you are looking for a 3D effect, in your flowerbed, at the edge of your water garden or for a container arrangement, you should opt for the beautifully striped and unique leaves of the 'Pharaoh's Mask' colocase. The hybridizer accentuated the very dark V-shaped veins of the 'Dark Star' colocase. The petioles are dark black and contrast well with its fluorescent foliage, with bright and luminous reflections. The edge of the sheet is folded backwards. The plant, with an erect habit, can reach 90 to 120 cm in height. Its basal branching is excellent. **A WOW effect worthy of the Pharaonic era... Unique...**



N Colocasia 'Polargreen'

Generally, colocaceae tolerate the temperatures of Quebec very well in the summer season, but who would have thought, we are offered a new selection that could survive until zone 5 for 2024! This is the first time that a colocaceae has been reported to be resistant in such a low hardiness zone, very close to zone 4. 'Polargreen' has medium green leaves with pink stems. This colocasis which emerges late in the season does not produce bulbs. It can reach 1 m in height.

Coprosma Pacific Sunrise™

Always spectacular, the foliage of the Pacific series coprosma selections is darker at the end of summer with the arrival of cool temperatures. The leaves are fleshy and leathery. The leaves of Pacific Sunrise™ are tinted bright red in the center and edged with burgundy chocolate on the periphery. This small shrub can reach 40 to 50 cm in height and 20 to 30 cm in width.



Coprosma Pacific Sunset®

This coprosma selection presents foliage that evolves as the season progresses. Always spectacular, the foliage is darker in late summer. Its coral red leaves are bordered with chocolate bronze, with a central area which brings together the two colors which mix there. They are fleshy and tough. This small shrub has a bushy and erect habit. The plant can reach 35 to 40 cm in height and 20 to 25 cm in spread. It is grown in the sun to show maximum coloring.



Cordyline australis **'Charlie Boy'**

Bronze medal Plantarium 2009

Its leaves, long and narrow, are strongly erect and richly colored burgundy. A pretty bright pink border highlights the burgundy. The growth of the plant is moderate. It can reach 45 to 50 cm in height. As this cultivar is more compact than the 'Pink Passion' selection, it is ideal for a smaller location. It replaces 'Cherry Sensation' which is no longer available at the moment. **A flamboyant choice.**



Cordyline australis **'Black Knight'**

A very stunning cordyline mainly because it has one of the darkest burgundy colors among the southern cordylines. The burgundy to black-purple color of its fine leaves gives it a very exotic appearance both in containers and in the ground. Its very **shiny** foliage makes it a superior choice to ". It is the perfect architectural plant to place on the terrace or balcony. The plant can reach 45 to 60 cm in height, with relatively rapid growth.



Cordyline australis Pink Passion® 'Seipin'

This little beauty was selected and introduced to the UK. Its narrow leaves are a combination of purple-gray in the center and pink at the edges, with the addition of white or beige at the tips of mature leaves. The leaves are thick and pointed. 'Pink Passion' retains its color well all summer. This specimen can reach 50 to 60 cm in height. It is an interesting asset for giving color to potted arrangements, both in the garden and on the terrace. **One of the largest.**



Cordyline australis 'Coral'

Its variegated leaves are elliptical and narrow, measuring only 2 to 3 cm wide. Very distinctive, they feature tones of coral pink, brown, purple and green. The color deepens as the plant matures. The plant, with an erect habit, can reach 50 to 60 cm in height and width with a good growth rate. **Unique in its color.**



Cordyline australis 'Red Sensation'

This cordyline with its erect and tight shape forms a robust trunk. Its growth is moderately rapid and the plant can reach 50 to 70 cm in height. Cordyline australis 'Southern Splendor'

This cordyline, which closely resembles 'Pink Passion', has long, thin pink leaves, tinted from dark gray-green to purplish in the center, which gives it a "neon" appearance. This cultivar is a mutation of the southern cordyline 'Red Star' discovered by the renowned New Zealand breeder Arthur Rendle in 1996. It was registered in 2008. **Graphic and erect.**

Cordyline australis 'Torbay Dazzler'

Award of Garden Merit RHS, 2002

The leaves of "Torbay Dazzler" have a pinkish midrib, a jade green center and cream margins. The leaves are narrow and tapered. The plant with its slightly open habit is well erect. Of moderate growth, it can reach 45 to 50 cm in height. **Different.**





▣ Cordyline Burgundy Spire™ ‘Jel01’

Burgundy Spire™ is one of the most sculptural and majestic cordylines with its intense chocolate burgundy color. Its leaves give off a beautiful light. This cordyline does not lose its leaves at the base as it grows, which makes it a very interesting characteristic which allows us to maintain a very bushy plant. The plant is well erect. Fast growing, it can reach 50 to 70 cm in height. **The queen of cordylines.**

Cordyline Dance™ Can Can

Unlike southern cordylines, Dance™ Can Can and Dance™ Cha Cha (crosses between *Cordyline banksii* and *Cordyline australis*) develop a leafy rosette habit, much like grasses. These are the only cordylines whose foliage changes color significantly as it matures. Dance™ Can Can leaves emerge in shades of pink and red and the mature leaf variation turns cream against a green background at the base of the plant. The four shades are present at the same time on the plant because of the constant evolution of its foliage. This fast-growing cordyline can reach 50 to 70 cm in height and spread. **A luminous beauty.**



Cordyline Dance™ Cha Cha

Unlike southern cordylines, Dance™ Can Can and Dance™ Cha Cha (crosses between *Cordyline banksii* and *Cordyline australis* in italics) develop a leafy rosette habit, a bit like grasses. Dance™ Cha Cha leaves emerge with a tone of apricot orange on a bronze background and the mature leaf variation turns yellow on a green background at the base over time. The four shades are present at the same time on the plant because of the constant evolution of its foliage. The plant can reach 50 to 70 cm in height and width. **An evolving beauty.**



Cordyline Dance™ Jive

This cultivar from the Dance™ series was selected for its vigor, narrow leaves and variegation. The leaves of Dance™ Jive initially present a bright emerald green hue variegated with cream. Then this coloring becomes yellowish on a dark forest green background. This cultivar comes from a line of crosses between a Banks cordyline and a southern cordyline. This is another creation of the famous New Zealand hybridist Peter Fraser. The plant can reach 60 to 70 cm in height. **Brilliant green.**

Cordyline Dance™ Paso Doble

Dance™ Paso Doble produces burgundy red leaves with a brilliant fuchsia pink border. The plant, of average vigor, develops a very erect silhouette, forming a single trunk. Its port remains narrow, giving it a slender shape. Of moderate growth, it can reach 40 to 50 cm in height. **The darkest of roses.**

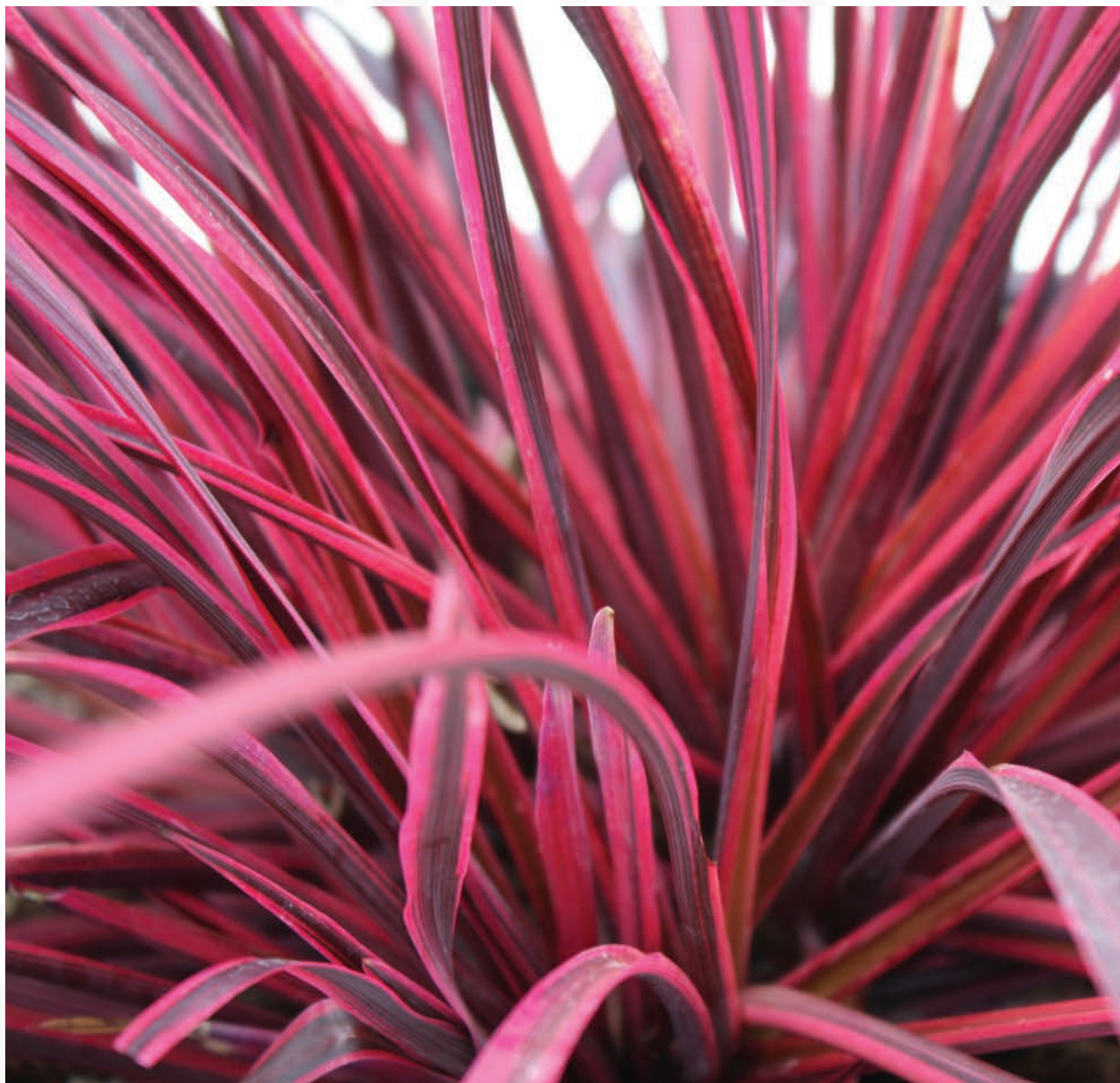


Cordyline australis Dance™ Salsa

This cordyline is part of the famous Dance™ group with a weeping port by New Zealander Peter Fraser which presents a magic of colors and astonishing light under the reflections of the sun. 'Salsa' has very showy raspberry red to brown leaves with a broad bright pink border. This cordyline can express its beauty both in containers and in the ground. The plant, with a single trunk, can reach 50 to 70 cm in height. **A great one in his form...**

Cordyline Festival™ Burgundy 'JURred'

This cordyline is a complex cross between the southern cordyline 'Purple Tower', Banks' cordyline and dwarf cordyline. This cordyline is well branched at its base and forms a plant with an **open habit**, evoking the shape of a fountain. It has very shiny burgundy leaves that measure 1.5 to 2 cm wide. Fast growing, Festival™ Burgundy quietly reaches a height of 60 to 80 cm. As its spread is important, you have to give it space. **Imposing and majestic.**



Cordyline Festival® Raspberry

Festival® Raspberry cordyline adds spectacular texture and color to the garden. Cordyline fruticosa Caruba™ Black 'Bra01'

This frutescent cordyline stands out with its very dark, burgundy, almost black leaves, which measure 7 to 8 cm wide. The plant can reach 50 to 70 cm in height and 30 to 40 cm in spread. The growth rate of this bushy cordyline is rapid. **The princess of the night.**



Cordyline obtecta Superstar 'Albatross'

This cordyline deserves its superstar name. Its unique trunk showcases large, glossy dark red-purple, almost black, leaves that can measure 2.5 to 5 cm wide. The species, an endemic to Norfolk Island, is distinguished from the species by significantly wider leaves. 'Superstar' has a growth rate two to three times higher than southern cordylines. The plant has an open, tiered shape. It can reach a height of 60 to 70 cm. **A Super Star.**

Cyperus alternifolius ‘Umbrella’

Award of Garden Merit 1993 – Alternate-leaved papyrus

The fascinating vegetation of the alternate-leaved papyrus is erect. The bracts form an umbrella at the end of the stems, hence the reference to its other common name of umbel plant. In the middle of the season, it wears a crown of tiny flowers. ‘Umbrella’ can reach a height of 60 to 75 cm and is the fastest spreading papyrus, given its height. **Rapid growth.**



Cyperus giganteus

The giant papyrus

The giant papyrus is remarkable for its vigor, its size and its large umbels. Its 1.5 to 2 m high stems are strong and straight. The radius of its umbels can sometimes measure 20 to 30 cm in diameter. The spread of the plant can vary between 60 to 75 cm. **A giant.**

Cyperus isocladius

This dwarf papyrus generally measures 45 to 60 cm in height and width. Flowering consisting of brownish-colored umbels occurs in July and lasts until frost. In a pool of water, we plant this Lilliputian papyrus at the edge of the water. Of course, it also grows very well in containers and brings lightness to arrangements. Cyperus papyrus 'Little Tut'

Paper papyrus

This papyrus is the best known of the group and is ideal for giving height to our flower pots. The result is magical and exultant. Cyperus papyrus 'Nile Queen'

Ensete ventricosum 'Maurelii'

The false red banana tree

In our temperate climate, this architectural plant with its flared shape reaches 1 to 1.5 m in height. Several colors can be observed on its immense paddle-shaped leaves which emerge from a red-tinted trunk: light green, brown, burgundy and black. A bright red central vein gives additional character to these large leaves. This plant can be grown in both sun and shade in very rich soil. **Structuring and original... An ever-popular classic.**



Euphorbia tirucalli 'Sticks on Fire'

Pencil spurge

Due to a lack of chlorophyll, this spectacular little leafless shrub takes on a fascinating color, a beautiful blushing golden yellow. Its color can vary from red to golden yellow depending on the season. The lack of chlorophyll slows its growth compared to that of the species. It is a "coraliform" euphorbia, in the sense that it recalls the shape of a coral. Its branches are as thin as a pencil. Even though this plant is drought tolerant, it appreciates regular watering when grown as an annual plant. It is grown in the sun or in light shade, in succulent plant potting soil or a planting substrate. Its colors are more pronounced under the sun. Grown as an annual plant, 'Sticks on Fire' can reach around 60cm during the season. **Added value: an excellent houseplant.**



Eupatorium capillifolium 'Elegant Feather'

Institutional and municipal spaces, golf courses, public gardens and our private gardens often require a majestic presence which structures them and gives them character. This is what this superb plant offers with wispy foliage which is spectacular in isolation or as a background screen in flower beds or as a featured plant in large flower pots. 'Elegant Feather' offers fluffy, finely divided soft green foliage on tall, very rigid stems, as these lignify quickly. This eupatory, very easy to grow, tolerates most types of soil, but it is in moist and rich soil, fresh and well drained, that it best expresses all its beauty. This robust and very structuring plant, with impeccable graphics, can be placed in full sun and shade. The plant can easily reach 1.5 to 2 m in height and 80 to 100 cm in width. **Gigantism with finesse.**



Deco. chic Fatsia japonica 'Spider's Web'

The Fatsie of Japan

This plant, a horticultural mutation of the Japanese fatsia 'Tsumugi Shibori', was spotted in Japan and named by Japanese variegated plant experts Yokoi and Hirose. 'Spider's Web' displays bright green palmate leaves with variegation that changes with the age of the plant and the seasons. The leaves are also splashed with small creamy white spots. These hues give the plant an unusual, frosty appearance. The leaves are cut into seven to nine lobes. The plant's habit, which can reach 1.2 to 1.5 m, is rounded and spreading. **Covers both the interior and exterior.**

Ficinia truncata 'Ice Crystal'

The truncated fcinia is native to South Africa where it has long been cultivated as an ornamental plant. The name of the species refers to the fact that the leaves are truncated, as if the tips of the leaves had been abruptly cut off. The 'Ice Crystal' selection forms a small, low tuft of narrow, dark green, slightly curved leaves. They are highlighted by a small white border formed by a fine pure white silky net, which gives it a frosted appearance, a design originality much appreciated by those who grow it. This plant, which is full of originality, resembles a sea anemone with its leaves all disheveled, delicately disordered. The stems extending from the base bear several leaves and can measure 10 to 15 cm in length. This plant, belonging to the Cyperaceae family, must be planted in draining soil with a good supply of organic manure when planting. This plant can be grown in a sunny location in a small container, on the edge of a flower bed, in a flowerbed, in a rockery or in an alpine garden. The plant can reach 15 cm in height and 25 cm in width. **Cut the flowerbeds finely.**



Ficus elastica 'Burgundy'

The elastic fig tree

This plant, grown for its foliage, has burgundy-black glazed leaves with a reddish central vein. The leaves, elliptical to oblong, can reach 20 to 30 cm in length and 12 to 15 cm in width. The expected size for this plant in the first year is 60 to 70 cm in height and 30 to 40 cm in spread. The species tolerates dry environmental conditions but performs better under humid temperatures. **The most known.**

Ficus elastica 'Ruby'

N 'Makatea' '17-527'

Heart-shaped chartreuse leaf, light orange tinted skin, white flesh, very vigorous climbing plant, shade tolerance, tuber for Asian and Caribbean cuisine, edible leaf for a mixed salad.

N 'Manihi' '17-40'

Millium effusum 'Flashlights'

Diffuse millet

This grass, hardy to zone 3, forms a taller of linear and arcuate golden yellow leaves. It is perfect for illuminating undergrowth or the edge of a path in a shaded area. Soft lighting also suits it. It can also be used in flower beds as well as in flower pot arrangements. When it survives our winters, it produces tiny golden spikelets the following year in June. Muehlenbeckia complexa 'Variegated'

Muehlenbeckie with small variegated leaves

Muehlenbeckies are deciduous shrubs which are used mainly for the decorative appearance of their foliage. In our climate, they are very effective hanging plants for our container arrangements. The small, oval, green leaves of 'Variegated' are speckled cream and pale yellow with sometimes a pinkish tint. Musa acuminata var. sumatrana 'Grand Nain'

This banana tree is an excellent fruit producer. DECO-Style® has included it in its collection of exotic plants, because in a single season it forms a spectacular plant in terms of its size. Its green leaves, irregularly streaked with chocolate, are quite wind resistant. Around mid-season, this banana tree already begins to produce new shoots for the next year. Musa acuminata var. sumatrana 'Mystik'

The magnificent leaves of this small banana tree are irregularly spotted with bronze, over more than 50% of the surface of the leaf. Musa basjoo

This species of banana tree, native to China and growing up to 3,000 m above sea level, is probably the most cold-resistant banana tree that gardeners in cold regions can grow. Be careful, this is only the heart of this Nordic banana tree, if properly installed, which can withstand temperatures between -15°C and -20°C under winter protection, like mulch. This tropical plant can reach 1.5 m in height. You should avoid planting it in high winds to protect its foliage.

Musa Super Dwarf Banana™

The super dwarf qualities of Super Dwarf Banana™ make it a small specimen with a symmetrical and compact appearance. This banana tree, revered by Buddhists, originates from the mountainous areas of Yunnan in China, growing at altitudes of up to 2,500 m. This origin means that it is quite resistant to the cold, its resistance to cold being comparable to the basho banana tree. It is very structured and small, hence its common name Chinese dwarf banana tree. Its other common name, golden lotus, was given to it in connection with its magnificent yellow lotus-shaped flower which can persist for 10 to 12 months. The flowers are followed by two to four small hairy bananas. Its leaves are thick and resist wind well. The upper leaf takes the shape of a vertical arrowhead. An interesting feature is its elephant's foot shape which is enhanced by the reddish border of the base of the petiole. This banana tree, with a well erect habit, can reach 80 to 120 cm in height. Nassella tenuissima 'Pony Tails'

Angel hair or thin hair

This very attractive grass produces fine whitish spikes, turning tawny as they age. Its fine inflorescences resemble a pony's tail. You have to see the very fine leaves of this plant waving in the slightest breeze to see the beauty of this plant. The plant forms a clump 50 to 60 cm high. **Movement in the wind.**

Pennisetum advena 'Cherry Sparkler'

This other mutation of foreign millet with red foliage ('Rubrum') comes from the 'Fireworks' and 'Sky Rocket' selections. This medium-sized cultivar is distinguished by a soft pink-red coloring that appears on its linear leaves, variegated with green and white. The pink-red shades become more pronounced as the length of the day increases. Full sun intensifies its coloring and contrast. 'Cherry Sparkler' requires heat. Its burgundy feather dusters stand well above its foliage. Like its predecessors, its height and spread can vary between 35 to 45 cm. **Bright foliage.**



Pennisetum advena 'Fireworks'

Our good old silky millet with purple foliage ('Rubrum'), a remarkably effective and refined plant, has had a makeover with a spectacular variegation. Its burgundy color has in fact edged with pink. The coloring varies depending on the temperature, the sunshine and the maturity of the plant, but this is precisely the main interest of this plant which can offer us a thousand different fireworks. The height and spread of this plant vary between 40 to 60 cm. **A fireworks display of colors.**

Pennisetum advena 'Fuzzy'

This grass produces numerous very decorative pink to purple spikes 10 to 15 cm long. The latter are very dense and feathery. The flowers contrast very well with the green linear leaves. Flowering remains attractive late into fall. This selection is essential in borders and large flower beds for its graphic and airy silhouette which brings movement and delicacy. The plant is robust and can reach 80 to 90 cm in height and 60 cm in width.





Pennisetum advena 'Rosy Red'

Pennisetum advena 'Sky Rocket'

This silky millet with vigorous growth, composed of bright, green linear leaves edged with creamy white, is very original. When flowering, this millet produces pink arched plumes which turn cream as they mature. 'Sky Rocket' can reach 60 to 70 cm in height and spread. **The most vigorous of the "Celebration" series.**



Pennisetum advena 'Rubrum Minimus'

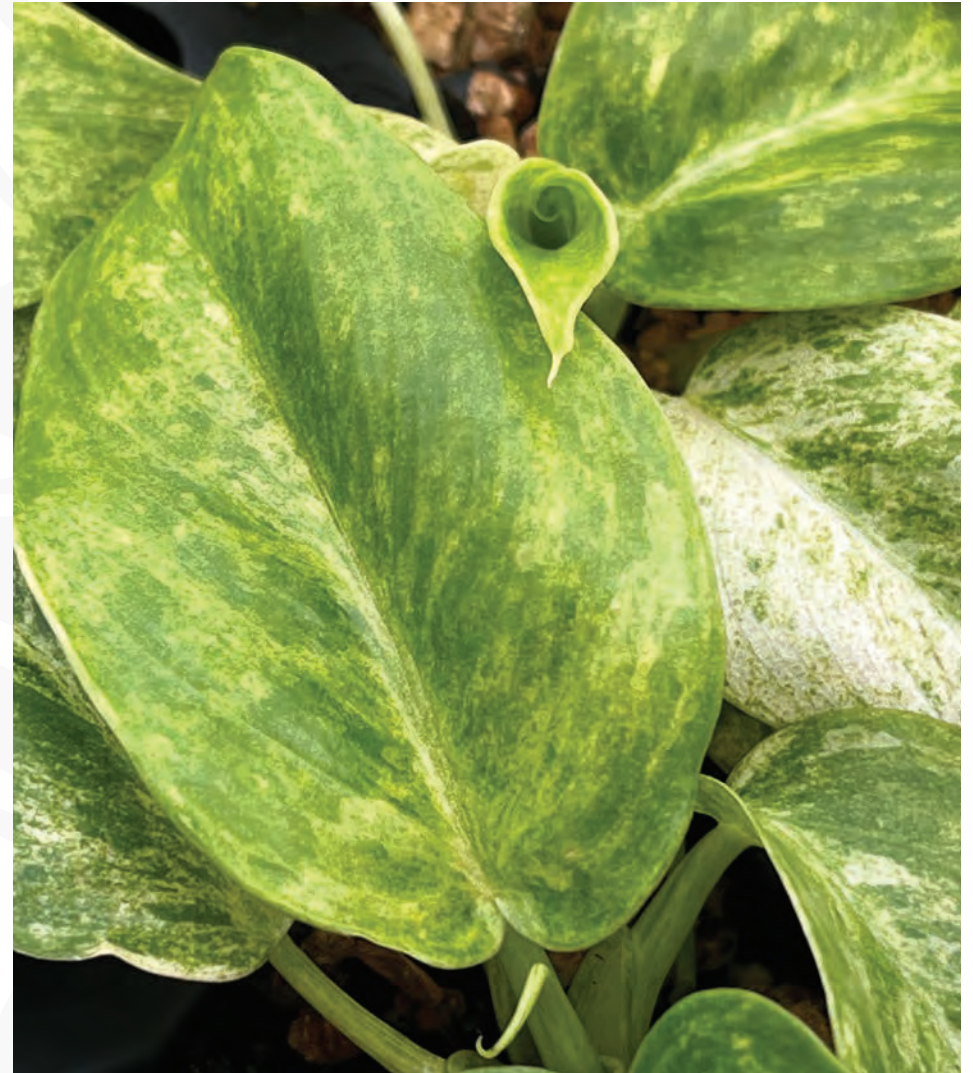

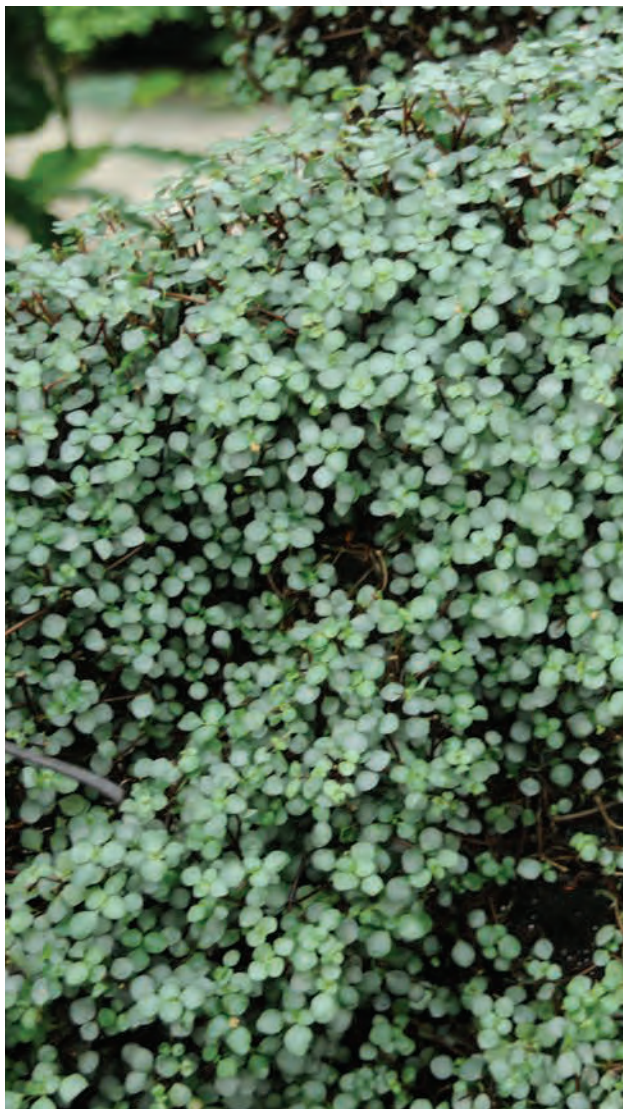


Philodendron giganteum 'Variegata'

This plant native to South America has large dark green leaves with yellow and creamy white variegation that develop like an elephant's ear. Its variegated design is unique to each leaf. It is an epiphytic climbing plant that is easy to grow indoors in indirect light. This species produces the largest leaves of the genus. The gigantic philodendron with variegated foliage is a plant that is perfect for improving the air quality in the home. Growth speed and leaf color vary depending on several factors such as growing soil, temperature and lighting.

power **Pilea glauca 'Aquamarine'**

This pilea is prized by gardeners mainly for its decorative foliage composed of small round, steel blue leaves, 6 mm in diameter. It is a creeping or trailing plant which forms a compact and dense bluish cushion. If your container arrangement calls for delicate foliage, 'Aquamarine' is an ideal candidate. This pilea can reach 2.5 to 3 cm in height and 70 to 90 cm in spread.

Staghorn / Elephant Ear Fern

The plants of the genus are curious epiphytic ferns that generally resemble the horns of a moose due to the shape of their frond. The species is distinguished from its congeners by its fertile fronds which do not fork like a deer antler but which are rather rounded with protruding veins. These are raised and turned outwards. Their large size means that its fronds are often compared to an elephant ear or a cabbage.



Plectranthus ciliatus 'Troy's Gold'

This plant with its gracefully drooping habit forms a mass of leaves tinted with golden yellow and luminous green that can rise to 15 to 20 cm in height and spread out over 35 to 50 cm. 'Troy's Gold' prefers cool morning sun and subdued sun thereafter, but it performs very well in a shady situation. This plant deserves to be recognized for its full value as a ground cover plant in flower beds, baskets and balcony boxes. Senecio candicans Angel Wings® 'Senaw'

Angel Wings® white groundsel is a bushy shrub, with evergreen and dazzling foliage, which can reach between 30 to 40 cm in height and 35 to 40 cm in width. The silhouette of the plant is very graphic. The large, spectacular leaves of this asteraceae are silvery white, thick and slightly fluffy. This plant, which often branches at the base, performs well in the sun and also tolerates shade. The plant grows well in soil enriched with organic matter. This ragwort goes well with all other plants, giving them added value, both in flowerbeds and in containers. **A true star from which light springs...**

Senecio 'Dunkey's Ears'

The foliage of this rather original ragwort, which was previously marketed under the name 'Bello Grigio', is composed of long, narrow gray-white leaves 20 to 25 cm long. They shine in the light and can be combined with almost all blooms. Additionally, its heavily fluffy grayish leaves can contrast elegantly with many foliage shapes and textures. It is a real star in container arrangements and at the edge of a flower bed. This vigorous plant with a rosette shape, which can reach 25 to 30 cm in height and width, branches itself from the base, requiring no pinching to develop well. It grows in the sun in well-drained soil, but it also tolerates shade.

Stenotaphrum secundatum 'Variegatum'

St. Augustine grass with variegated leaves

This ground cover or trailing plant tolerates almost all types of soil and exposure. It requires a lot of humidity. St. Augustine grass with variegated leaves is composed of cream leaves, striped with green lines and slightly shaded with pink. It benefits from being grown in suspension in a large container, isolated or in an arrangement. It can also be used to highlight structures such as low walls or stairs. The leaf resembles an avian leg. The creeping, aggressive reddish-purple stems of this plant easily reach 150 to 200 cm in length. **Gentle aggression.**



Syngonium podophyllum Coral Allusion™

Like all cultivars in the Allusion™ series, this new selection from the Illusion™ collection has pink veins, but they are less visible than other members of the series. Indeed, the coral color of the leaf is quite intense. Despite this, the pink color is present just enough to create a unique pattern in this series. This is why this syngonium will appeal to daring gardeners who want to give a touch of originality to their garden or interior. The plant can reach 15 to 20 cm in height and at least 20 to 50 cm in width.



Syngonium podophyllum Bright Allusion™

The Bright Allusion™ cultivar is a brighter selection than its Berry Illusion™ parent. It forms a very tight clump of arrowhead-shaped leaves that branches quickly at the base of the plant. The overall color of the leaves is very pale green, with undertones of white. Prominent pink-red veins give a beautiful pinkish appearance to new growth. The plant can reach 15 to 20 cm in height and at least 20 to 50 cm in spread. This selection requires good light to maintain the intensity and contrast of its colors, but direct sunlight should be avoided. It is an ideal plant for indoors as well as to enhance a container combination.

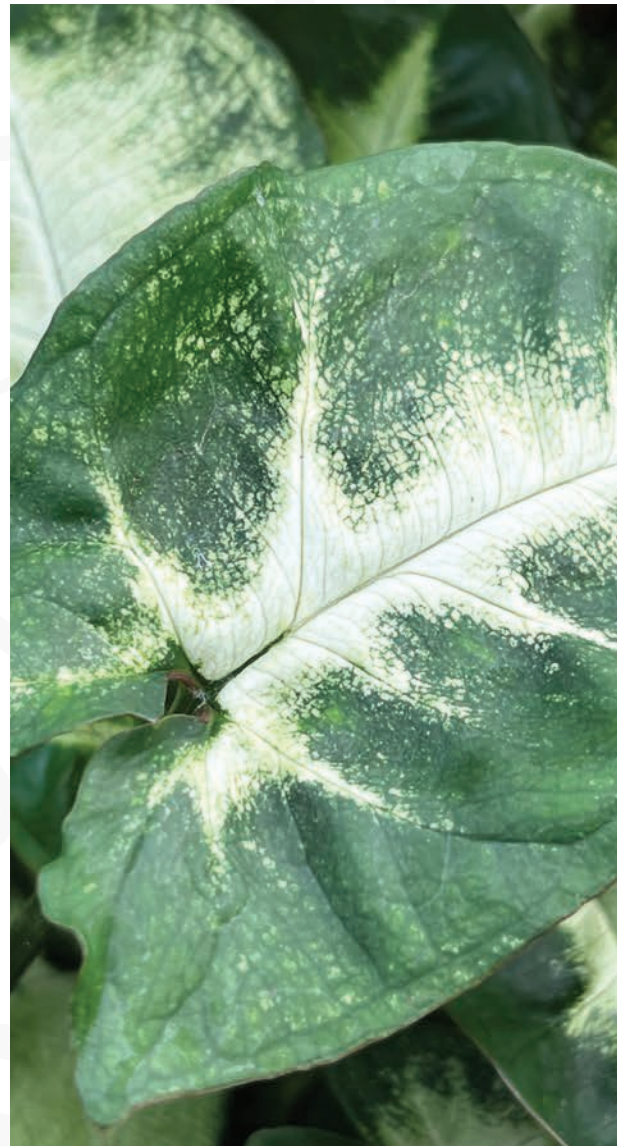


Syngonium podophyllum Mango Illusion™

Like all its congeners, this selection produces short, pointed leaves in the shape of an arrow: these are slightly shaded with peach and pink on a pale green background. The design is most colorful on mature leaves and along the midribs. Over time, its stems lengthen and take on a rather climbing or hanging habit. The plant can reach 15 to 20 cm in height and 20 to 50 cm in width.

Syngonium podophyllum 'Neon Robusta'

The 'Neon Robusta' selection is a natural mutation of the 'Neon' cultivar. This syngonium is much appreciated for its foliage which changes from light green to creamy, lacquered pink. The underside of the leaf is tinted a beautiful pure green. 'Neon Robusta' forms a compact and dense plant. It is a very easy to grow plant that is perfect for beginners. Depending on its maturity, the width of the plant can vary between 20 to 50 cm.



Syngonium 'Pixie'

This selection of syngonium podophyllum is distinguished by dark green leaves at the edges and a creamy white variegation in the center of the leaf. Its very shiny pattern gives it an elegant and unique appearance. The foliage of this small, strong and vigorous plant darkens over time. The plant is relatively compact and if we respect its creeping and climbing nature it can then reach at least 20 to 50 cm in width.

Syngonium 'Randy'

There are several selections of syngoniums with lanceolate green leaves, variegated with white or lime green and as such 'Randy' is a masterpiece. The companionship between the dark green and white of the variegation of the syngonium 'Randy' catches the eye with its striking contrast. The plant is relatively compact and can be grown with a bushy appearance of 15 to 20 cm in height or we respect its creeping and climbing nature which can then reach at least 20 to 50 cm in width.



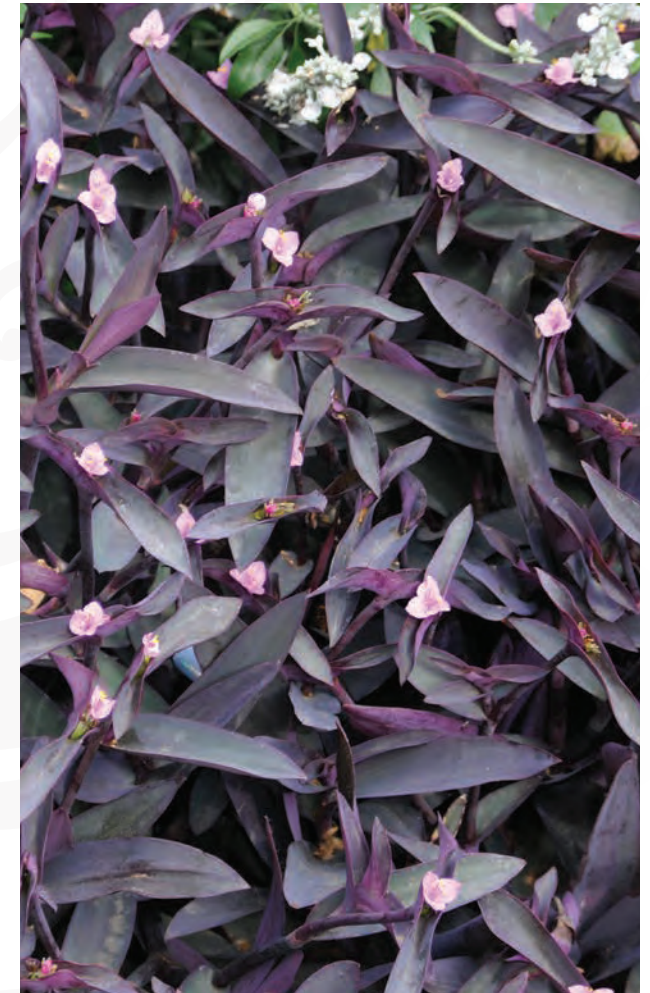
Syngonium podophyllum **'White Butterfly'**

The silvery white leaves accented with lime green shades of 'White Butterfly' create a subtle decorative effect for any interior. New shoots are heart-shaped. The mature leaves are arrow-shaped and give the unique illusion of a butterfly wing. Flowering is very rare in cultivation. Indoors, the plant with its bushy and erect habit, when young, can reach 45 to 60 cm in spread as it matures. The plant can also be grown outdoors like all syngoniums, when the weather for warm nights has arrived.



Tradescantia pallida **'Purple Heart'**

The pale spiderwort, better known by its common name purple spiderwort, is appreciated for its decorative foliage. Its long purple stems are fleshy and bear hairy purple-purple leaves tinged with green-gray. Pinching the stems improves the structure of the plant. This plant has a rather spreading habit. The plant can reach 15 to 25 cm in height and 30 to 45 cm in spread. The pale tradescantia accepts almost all types of soil as long as it is well drained. It can be grown in sun or partial shade, but if it has too much shade its purple coloring is attenuated.



Tradescantia pallida **'Pink Stripes'**

Variegated leaf purple misery

This cultivar is a DECO-Style® selection which offers a much more colorful variegation than the cultivar 'Variegata'. The leaves of this companion plant, shades of dark purple and bright pink, measure 7 to 15 cm in length. Although this beautiful exotic tolerates shade, bright light intensifies its coloring. Placed on the edge of a flower bed, its contrasting effects are magnificent. The plant can reach 15 to 20 cm in height and 20 to 30 cm in spread. Give it compost when planting and it will give you hours of pleasure during the summer.

Tradescantia callisia 'Pink Panther'

Spiderwort or creeping callisia

This cute little indoor plant that can be grown outdoors in the warm months of the year is unrivaled for brightening up dull spaces. Its small ice green leaves, tinged with white and purplish pink, form a dense tuft which cascades gently over the edge of the containers. The plant can reach 15 cm in height and 30 to 35 cm in width. An explosion of colors.

Tradescantia spathacea 'Amber Waves'

The spathe spiderwort 'Amber Waves'

The rhoeo or spiderwort excels as a houseplant and can also be grown outdoors in the warmer months. 'Amber Waves' forms upright, rosette-shaped foliage, which can measure 20 to 30 cm in height and width. The leaves have a very bright amber color. Green stripes create a beautiful contrast on the "amber wave". The underside of the foliage is colored salmon pink. This plant goes well with landscaping in flowerbeds and containers as well as in collections of indoor plants. **WOW!**



Xanthosoma sagittifolium 'Lime Zinger'

The xanthosome with sagittal leaves (iron-shaped leaves) is native to the Amazon basin. At first glance, the sagittate-leaved xanthosoma or macabo is almost similar to the edible colocasia or taro.

First of all, it is their size that differentiates them: the macabos are more developed than the colocaceae. Xanthosomes also have larger tubercles than colocaceae. Another difference: the leaves of xanthosomes are sagittal while the leaves of colocaceae are peltate.

Finally, the gender is of American origin while the gender is of Asian origin. Alocases are also very close to xanthonomas and colocaceae.

The cultivar 'Lime Zinger' stands out in ornamental cultivation with its chartreuse foliage. Only one word to describe the merits of its decorative leaves: bright! bright! bright! The sturdy petioles that carry its remarkable leaves are longer than these. The latter, heart-shaped, can measure up to 45 cm in length.

This xanthosome with golden foliage can be grown in sun or shade where it retains its color, in moist, well-drained and fertile soil. If it is well fed, its growth rate is rapid, especially if the heat is there. This bright plant can reach 60 to 80 cm in height and 60 to 75 cm in width. A lack of water tends to stunt the growth of the plant and burns the leaf margins.

Zantedeschia aethiopica 'White Giant'

The Ethiopian calla

It is considered a wetland plant like cannas, papyrus and sedges. It still tolerates cultivation in the ground and in containers well, especially in summer when it needs less water, as in its habitat in the dry season. Its shiny, dark green leaves, sagittate and speckled with white, are carried by a long erect petiole. The delicately scented inflorescences emerge well above the foliage. They form a large white spathe erect and flared in the shape of a horn with a yellow spadix. The plant can reach 50 to 70 cm in height. This plant can be grown in sun or partial shade. Its growth is rapid.



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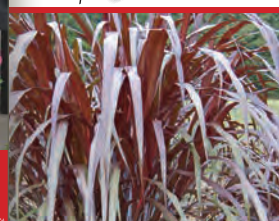
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
